

Pastor's Notes

Moses said, "This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you." Exodus 24:8

Jesus said, "This is **my** blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." Mark 14:24

What does it mean to receive the "blood of the covenant"? For our ancestors in the desert, newly freed from slavery in Egypt, it was the blood of young bulls that were sacrificed as an offering to God. As it was sprinkled over their heads, they united their lives, and their journey in a covenant with God and God's commands. At the Last Supper, Jesus offered *his own* blood, soon to be shed on the Cross, as a *new and everlasting covenant* between God and all who would not merely be sprinkled with it, but who would take it into themselves. This is the lifeblood of God's love that flows through us who receive it for the life of the world.


The cup of blessing from the Seder meal became, for the first Christians, the cup of Eucharist, the Blood of Christ, when they gathered on the first day of each week. Then, at some point in our history, the Blood of Christ came to be considered "too sacred" to be received by all in the assembly. Only the priest drank from the cup the Blood of Christ, the blood of the new covenant. The invitation for all to share from the cup of salvation resumed only within the last 50 years. Even then, the offer was not extended in all times or places. Then again, under the restrictions brought about by the coronavirus, only those at the altar may drink from the cup holding the Blood of Christ. How much of a challenge will it be for each of us to return to sharing from the cup when that restriction is lifted?

Gratefully, our understanding of the presence of Christ in the Eucharist is not so literal as to separate his Body from his Blood. We believe that, when we receive the Eucharist in *either* form, we share fully in the living Body <u>and</u> Blood of Christ; we are renewed in the new and everlasting covenant. Why is this important? For our ancestors, blood was the life force that flowed through them and through the animals that were offered in sacrifice. To shed blood was to sacrifice life toward something greater. To this day, we speak of those who sacrifice their lives to protect others as shedding their blood for a greater good.

To share in the Blood of Christ is to share in the sacrifice of his life for us all. To say "Amen" to the Body and Blood of Christ, present in the Eucharist, is to offer our lives in service to God's command of love. To receive the Body and Blood of Christ, whether in the form of bread or wine, or both, is to become one with Christ and with one another in a commitment to give of ourselves in service to others. In receiving the Eucharist, we receive forgiveness for all the ordinary sins of our lives when we place them before the Lord as we gather for Eucharist.

May we invite the lifeblood of Christ to flow through and among us. May our celebration of Eucharist be a joyful recommitment to go out and bring God's love to others in word and action. May we be seen by others as a people of the new and everlasting covenant, God's precious gift to us who receive the Body and Blood of Christ.


Bringing Communion To You
