Pastor's Notes

Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body.

1 Corinthians 10:17

We live in a moment of history in which forces within and around us attempt to divide us: by political party, race, creed, social class, education, or any one of many labels. Labels can fool us into believing that we "know" another person before they even open their mouth. And so, we stop listening to one another. We begin to focus on our counterattack before the other person has finished their thought. We get caught up in an argument with predictable results, each of us convinced that the wall between us will never be breached.

Yet we gather each weekend, whether virtually or in person, for a ritual that seeks to break down walls and unite us; to re-form and send us as one body in Christ. We are created as diverse members of one body; but when we divide ourselves into opposing groups, we become a *dis-eased* body that <u>cannot</u> bring Christ's light into the world. Still God persists. God fed the people of Israel in the desert despite their stubbornness and hardness of heart; so Christ continues to feed us with his own Body and Blood despite our resistance to living in harmony. Christ continues to hope that we will open to the breath of the Spirit and the transforming power of the Eucharist – that we might become what we eat and drink: his saving Bread and life-giving Blood for the world.

We are confronted with the ugly sin of racism that has been alive in our land for over 400 years. Those of my generation lived through a civil rights movement over 50 years ago that made radical changes in the ways race was a tool to separate, divide, and degrade people because of the color of their skin. Many of us were foolish enough to think that the work was done. We paid little attention to the painful stories of our sisters and brothers of color. We thought of those stories as exaggerations, exceptions

to the rule, or a problem that people had brought on themselves.

The events of recent weeks call us all to a new and deeper commitment to listen to one another; to hear the painful stories of the lived consequences of racism. They are seen in a pandemic that disproportionately claims the lives of people of color and acts of violence for which justice is obtained only when the violence is caught on video. Many young people have been showing us that they get it; they have stood side by side in peaceful protests, one body of many colors, many voices, and many expressions. I think it may be time for us to learn from them. They may not yet join with us on Sunday as often as we hope. Nonetheless, they reveal Christ in our world: one body of many diverse members; learning from one another; affirming the dignity of each person; opposing anything that would treat another as undeserving of honor, dignity, and respect.

Are we willing to listen and to learn from the people we have placed on the "other side" of a wall we helped to build? Are we willing to forgive the one whose words or actions helped to build that wall? Are we willing to seek the spark of the divine in the other that might poke holes in the wall that divides us? Are we willing to let Christ be, within and among us, what we cannot be on our own? Are we willing to be what we receive — the Body of Jesus? In the words of Kathy Sherman, CSJ,



RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation is being celebrated on Saturday mornings, from 9-10AM in the lower Unity Hall vestibule. Enter from the parking lot through the courtyard between the church and education buildings. Please observe the outside markings for social distancing and wear a mask. In bad weather, please line up your cars and wait in the car until the prior person leaves the vestibule.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Archdiocese has issued the following guidelines for celebration of the Anointing of the Sick until further notice.

"Under the State's exemption for essential services, the Archdiocese of Chicago is including Anointing of the Sick as an essential service. However, out of an abundance of caution only a select number of priests will be allowed to administer this sacrament to any confirmed COVID-19 patients until further notice. When a request is made for a priest to administer this sacrament, the priest must inquire if the ill person is a confirmed COVID-19 patient.

- lf no, the priest may proceed under the following guidelines.
 - The priest must maintain social distance with everyone present so as to offer comfort without making physical contact.
 - The priest must wash or sanitize his hands with soap and warm water both before entering the room and after leaving.
 - The anointing must be done with a cotton-tipped swab or a cotton ball which will be burned or buried after use.
 - Bleach wipes or soap and water will be used to sanitize all supplies both before and after the anointing.
 - If the sacrament is celebrated in a health care facility, the priest must follow the protocols and protective quidelines of that facility.
- ▶ If yes, the family must be notified that, due to guidelines set forth by the archdiocese to ensure everyone's health, another priest must take the call and that the family will be contacted by that priest. Explain to the family members that out of an abundance of caution only a select number of our priests are allowed to administer this sacrament to any confirmed COVID-19 patients until further notice. (4 priests will be designated priests in each Vicariate who are under age 60 and in good health). These priests will follow special precautions established by the Archdiocese."

CHRISTIAN BURIALS


The Archdiocese has issued the following guidelines for funeral services and burials until further notice.

"Burials at Catholic Cemeteries may continue and are not suspended at this time; however, attendance limit and social distancing requirements apply per below. Please note that our churches are still closed; therefore, funeral Masses are not possible.

However, if a family requests a funeral, there are two options:

- 1. A funeral service, not a Mass, may take place at the funeral home
 - a. the limit for attendees remains 10 people at this time (inclusive of the funeral director, priest, mourners, etc.)
 - b. All attendees must practice social distancing
- 2. A funeral service may take place graveside at the cemetery before committal/burial.
 - a. the limit for attendees remains 10 people at this time (inclusive of the funeral director, priest, mourners, etc.)
 - b. All attendees must practice social distancing"

Please note that the family <u>can</u> plan to celebrate a Funeral Mass at the church once restrictions have been lifted, even when the burial already has occurred.

Habitat For Humanity

Through the generous contribution of time, talent, and treasure, the St. Francis Xavier community has been supporting the Clarksdale Mississippi Habitat for Humanity program for 25 years. Every summer SFX sends several teams to Clarksdale to work on homes and we have provided new homes to over 50 deserving families. To build a home, the local Habitat chapter must raise about \$50,000. Upon completion, the resident is provided an interest-free loan to pay for the home. Through your generous support last year, we were able to drywall and paint the home we started the previous year and it is now nearly ready for a family. We also performed repair work on several current Habitat homes, enabling the families to secure insurance.

While the pandemic may affect our ability to send teams this summer to continue our work to provide affordable housing for those in need, the needs of the Clarksdale Habitat Chapter and community have not changed. In fact, in many ways their situation has become more dire because no other church groups or volunteer organizations have been able to go to Clarksdale. Therefore, we are asking for your support. If we are able to send groups, your support will go directly to funding the construction materials for the Habitat houses. The volunteers fund their own food and expenses for the trip. If we are not able to send groups, your support will go toward supporting the local Chapter in providing needed services and to fund repairs to the existing Habitat homes.

We understand that during this time you have many competing requests or personal situations, but please be a generous as you are able. Your donations have a direct effect on our ability to provide affordable housing to well deserving families. 

Sew...We Need Your Help!

If you can sew, we need your help! Disposable face masks are in short supply and fabric masks can help our healthcare workers and senior citizens. There are many designs online but simple is best. The instructions below for a simple mask can be adapted depending on what you have available. Tightly woven cotton fabric is best. If you don't have flannel for the lining, use two layers of cotton fabric. If you don't have elastic, use bias tape or fabric to edge the short end of the mask and make 10-12" ties on each corner.

Please put your completed masks in a plastic bag and drop them in the box. They will be distributed as needed to local health care providers, nursing homes, etc.

Since many stores will be mandatory closed, fabric can be purchased at Walmart, Amazon or mail order from Joann Fabrics.

How to make a Face Mask

Materials Needed:


Fabric 1 - Cotton Fabric

Fabric 2 - Cotton or Flannel for the backing

1/8" Flat elastic (If you don't have elastic, use bias tape or fabric to edge the short end of the mask and make 10-12" ties on each corner.)

- 1. Put right sides of cotton fabric together.
- 2. Cut 9" x 6"
- 3. Starting along one of the 9" sides from about 3 inches from the corner, begin sewing the bottom edge, sew to the first corner, stop. Place the elastic into the corner and sew back and forth a couple of times to make sure it is secure.
- 4. Continue sewing along the 6" side and stop before the corner. Bring the other end of that same electric to the corner and sew back and forth a couple of times.
- 5. Next sew across the top of the mask to the next corner. Again put the elastic in the corner and sew back and forth.
- 6. Continue sewing to the next corner and place the elastic into the corner and sew back and forth.
- 7. Sew across the bottom leaving about 1.5" to 2" open. Stop, cut the thread. Turn in-side out.
- 8. Pin 3 tucks on each side of the mask. Make sure the tucks are the same direction.
- 9. Sew around the edge of the mask twice.

Be sure the fabric design is place horizontally.
