

#### **Pastor's Notes**

A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up.

Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion.

Mark 4:37-38

When I was five years old, our mom was diagnosed with tuberculosis and confined to a sanitorium until she returned to full health. Our father. with the help of our grandmother, became sole parent of three children, ages 5, 3, and one and a half, while continuing to work full time. The day we learned that mom would have to leave us for a while was a day of many tears. Yet, I recall the months that followed as a time of hope and joy. We would fill dad's pockets with "contraband" that he would "sneak" to mom on his regular visits; he let my sister and me sit in the car. outside the gates, so that we could feel near to mom even if we could not see her. (Yes, it was safe to do that in those days; and we had the guard at the gate to keep an eye on us.) Dad came up with projects to occupy and distract us. He shared the news of their visits, including the anticipated arrival of our youngest brother, who had begun to grow within mom when she entered the sanitorium.

Dad gave us confidence that all would be well. I cannot imagine all that dad must have been carrying inside him during those months: caring for us and worrying about mom and the child in her womb. Yet, as far as we could see, he was like Jesus in the storm-tossed boat, peacefully asleep on a cushion. That, for me, is the gift of a father's love.

Fatherhood was a changing and often confusing vocation during my childhood. I came to appreciate my father more as I grew older. I will be forever grateful for the loving relationship we developed as adults. This weekend, our nation honors the men among us who live the vocation

of fatherhood as fathers (by birth and adoption), foster fathers, stepfathers, grandfathers, godfathers, mentors, and coaches. We give thanks for those who blessed our lives through their loving guidance. Perhaps some among us seek the grace of forgiveness and peace for fathers who caused harm by what they did or failed to do. We pray for them all and offer them our love and support. **Happy Father's Day!** 

This is my last column for the summer. I will take some of my own advice, slow the pace, and give God some extra space in my life. So, I take this opportunity to thank Ms. Terri Simeoni for her years of dedicated ministry to the people of St. Francis Xavier Parish. I first met Terri's family in 1980 as a deacon in the parish in which Terri grew up. I got to know her better when I came to SFX in 1990; Terri was then a teacher in the parish elementary school. I was here as she became coordinator of youth ministry and then coordinator of the parish School of Religious Education, still serving in that role when I returned 25 years later. Terri was willing to postpone her retirement for one year so that she could develop an interim virtual School of Religious Education. Thank you, Terri, for the blessing of 32 years of loving and dedicated service to this parish!

A lilac bush has been planted in the Unity Hall courtyard garden in honor of Terri and in memory of her mother, Mary, who became part of her ministry and this parish over the years. God bless you, Terri, in all that awaits you in your retirement journey. You always have a home among us.

#### **Collection For Retired Priests**



There are over 200 Retired Archdiocesan Priests. They represent 30% of all the priests serving in the Archdiocese. Normal retirement age is 70 for Chicago priests. Sixty-five priests still live in a rectory and assist the parish on a regular basis. Close to 140 retired priests celebrate Sunday Mass weekly, perform marriages and baptisms; and visit the sick in hospitals. Without these dedicated men, many parishes would not be able to offer the full range of Masses and sacraments that are currently available.

This collection is solely for the retired priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The retired priests of the Archdiocese receive no funds from the Religious Retirement Collection taken up in December. Those funds go for religious nuns and brothers and religious order priests.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is committed to caring for our retired priests, but we need your assistance and the generosity of every parish community.

#### Phase 5 Reopening Guidelines for St. Francis Xavier

On June 11, the State of Illinois moved to Phase 5 of the State reopening plan. **Thank you** to the many volunteers who made it possible for us to keep our parish church open over the past eleven months, and to those who have been praying for our return to full communion. The following changes are now in effect:

- Reservations are no longer required for weekend or daily Masses. There will be no reservation sheets at the Ogden Avenue doors.
- Those requiring gluten free hosts must now come to the sacristy before Mass to inform the sacristan.
- The Ogden and Spring Avenue doors are both available for <u>all</u> worshippers. As of June 26, the west transept and exterior Unity Hall doors (with access to the lift) also will be open.
- Greeters will greet people at the door and answer any questions. Hand sanitizer will be available at the door for people to use but is not required. Through June 20, masks will be required for everyone over age 2. As of June 26, face masks will be required only for those not fully vaccinated.
- Ribbons have been placed across the ends of every other pew in the back of the nave and in the east transept. This provides a 6 foot social distance for those uncomfortable with being any closer. <u>All pews in the rest of the church</u> are available for seating. Worshippers will seat themselves.
- Unity Hall will reopen to allow families with small children the option to view Mass remotely at the Saturday 5PM Mass and the Sunday 9AM and 11AM Masses. At all other Masses, the doors from the church into Unity Hall will be locked.
- **Ushers** are meeting this week and eventually will take responsibility for finding seats for people and guiding the communion procession.
- No **collection** will be taken during the Preparation of the Gifts. Offerings can be deposited in the collection boxes at the Ogden and Spring Avenue doors, and a new collection box at the west transept door (yet to be installed).
- Within the next few weeks, we will invite the assembly to join the cantor in **singing**. Stay tuned for more.
- We ask worshippers to respect the comfort level of others during the Sign of Peace.
- Until the ushers have returned, a greeter will continue to let each pew know when to come forward for **communion**. Sanitizer will be <u>available</u> at the front of the aisle for those who want to use it before receiving.
- Restoring will occur only <u>after</u> the Sunday 9AM and 11AM Masses and <u>before</u> the Saturday 5PM Mass.
- Reconciliation will take place at the top of the steps in Unity Hall with access from the courtyard doors. Since this area can be seen from the bottom of the stairs, a greeter will not be needed. We will move back to the Reconciliation Room once an air purifier has been installed.

#### **Greeters Welcome**

We are seeking parishioners who are willing and able to serve as ministers of hospitality (greeters) at the following parish celebrations.

- Weekend Masses: Greeters will welcome people at each of the church entrances and answer any questions. They then can join their families for the remainder of the Mass.
- Baptisms: Greeters welcome the family of the child being baptized, verify the information for the parish records, and assist in the seating process.
- **Weddings:** Greeters serve as part of our parish Wedding Ministry to welcome guests, answer questions, and assist the bride and groom and their parents with any special needs.
- Funerals: Greeters serve as part of the parish Bereavement Team. They welcome guests at the door, answer questions, and assist the family with any special needs.

#### **Special Circumstances For Receiving The Eucharist**


The Catholic Church has historically recognized the intimate relationship of wheat hosts and wine as matter for the Eucharist. However, if you have Celiac Sprue Disease or a family member suffers from a gluten intolerance or if you are alcohol intolerant, receiving the Eucharist is life-involving in seriously challenging ways. The logistics or manner of accommodating lay persons with gluten or wine intolerance in a parish setting during the Liturgy of the Eucharist is left to the afflicated party and the pastor to decide the best way during Mass for the afflicted party to safely receive the Precious Body or the Precious Blood.

# ST. FRANCIS XAVIER CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

SUMMER 2021

It's been awhile since we last reported on the Capital Campaign. For those who are new to our parish, a little background: our Prophetic Plan, discerned through prayer and the hard work of staff, volunteers, and parishioners, identified eight goals. One was to "continue building strong relationships within our parish and beyond." Another was "to maintain, enhance, and expand the parish facilities." To work toward these two goals, the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Capital Campaign was launched: *We Gather in Faith...We Give with Love*. Fundraising began in 2013 to commemorate the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the parish. Our first of several sharing contributions to St. Agatha and Ascension – St. Susanna Parishes were made in 2015, and construction to our campus commenced in 2016.

Now in 2021, our last project under the Capital Campaign umbrella is almost complete. You will see evidence of the installation to a fire detection system throughout the church, including the east transept entryway and near the statues of Francis Xavier and Therese of the Little Flower above the transept doors. Our final campaign payment was received in December 2020. All projects within the original scope, AND MORE, were completed with the \$4.2 million in parishioner contributions and \$800,000 in bequests received. The opposite page summarizes it all. I expect that we will have a little left over that we can use toward the new Education Building roof over the second-floor classrooms. We will continue to install engraved bricks in Unity Garden for the foreseeable future.

It has been a blessing to manage these capital projects after taking over the reins of a successful fundraising campaign under my predecessor, Clara Jurivich. On behalf of Fr. Bill Tkachuk and Fr. John Hoffman, I thank the Capital Campaign Committees, Building and Grounds Committee, and Finance Council for their leadership throughout the past 8 years, as well as over 1,000 families who supported the campaign and projects with their time in prayer, sharing of talents, and financial support.

It is with overwhelming gratitude that I use this symbol at right for the last time.


