

We met for lunch, he met with the parish staff, and our resounding response was "YES!" Then the pandemic shut down the Archdiocesan process for assigning priests – <u>until now</u>. On July 15th, **Fr. Rich Milek** (pronounced **Mee**-wek) **becomes our new Associate Pastor**. Fr. Rich offers the following introduction as he prepares to move in this week (apparently with a little friend). **Welcome, Fr. Rich and friend!**

Summer Peace, Fr. Bill



My name is Fr. Richard Milek, and I am known to parishioners and friends, as Fr. Rich. I was born and ordained in Poland. I came to Chicago in 1989 for a vacation and I have been on vacation for over 31 years. I became an American citizen through the naturalization process and a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago through the incardination process a long time ago. I thank God every day for this excellent opportunity to be here and serve the people of this local Church, who are for me a beautiful example of faith.

I served as Associate Pastor at Holy Innocents Parish (Chicago/Ashland), St. Luke in River Forest and St. Ita on the north side. After being incardinated to the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1999, I was appointed as the first Rector of Bishop Abramowicz Seminary (a transitional year for Polish seminarians hoping to become Chicago priests). In 2002 I became pastor of St. Helen Parish in Chicago (Augusta/Western) for six years; I was asked to accept the duties of Administrator of St Albert the Great Parish in Burbank for three years; and then became pastor of St. Francis Borgia (Addison/Cumberland) for six years. I then took a six-month Sabbatical from July 2017 to January 2018. While waiting for a new assignment, I was appointed Associate Pastor at St. John of the Cross in Western Springs. On July 1, 2018 I became a pastor of St. Constance Parish in Chicago. In November last year I had knee surgery followed by a long rehabilitation; I had to leave the parish and take a medical leave until now. I am grateful to God and Cardinal Cupich for my new assignment as Associate Pastor at St. Francis Xavier Parish, and I am thankful to Fr. Bill and the staff for accepting and welcoming me. I ask all of you for patience, understanding, and directions at the beginning of my ministry here at St. Francis Xavier Parish.

I love pastoral work especially celebrating Masses and Sacraments, working with the Elementary School and

Religious Ed, visiting the sick, and participating in all parish and school events where I can meet and get to know people better. I like music and sports, especially soccer, basketball, and hockey. I am a Blackhawks, Bulls, and Chicago Fire fan. I have a baby painted turtle as a pet; but I don't know if I can bring him with me (I didn't ask yet if the pets are allowed in the rectory). In the worst scenario, I will smuggle him in my pocket. ©

TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS – Phase 2 For Sunday and Weekday Masses beginning July 11

WHAT TO EXPECT

We are looking forward to seeing you back for Mass! Please remember that all present will have varying degrees of comfort with the situation. Please do not take offense at any gesture, or lack thereof. We are ALL present for one purpose: to be in communion with God.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

Make your reservation online: www.sfxlg.org

If you do not have internet access, call the rectory on Monday or Tuesday morning.

Check your temperature. If you have a fever and/or do not feel well, please do not come to church.

Please bring a Face Covering.

One bathroom will be available at the back of the church.

Unity Hall will not be accessible.

Please do not bring any food or drinks into the church.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

Enter through the center door on Ogden Avenue.

Please keep your face covering or mask on at all times (you will receive instructions during the service if receiving Communion).

A greeter will welcome you and check you in. In order to assist health officials if needed, we will keep a listing with your name and contact information for two weeks. The listing will be destroyed after 14 days.

The greeter will show you where you can sanitize your hands.



Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on floor)

Ushers will direct you to pews with markings on where to sit. You may sit next to those with whom you are domiciled if they arrive with you. You are not able to choose your seat.

DURING THE SERVICE

Masks must be worn the entire time you are in the church.

Please note that no worship aids/hymnals will be available, as congregational singing is not allowed at this time. The cantor, who has been directed to be socially distanced at 10 to 12 feet away from the Presider and pianist, will be offering the sung prayer. All are welcome to hum along to the songs/hymns as an alternative way of participating.

If you need to leave your seat during the service (other than Communion or for the bathroom), please do not stand in areas that cannot accommodate social distancing. If you leave the building, you ordinarily will not be able to return.

No physical sign of peace will be exchanged between those you are not domiciled with (but feel free to make a peace gesture!)









Follow instructions from Communion, which the presider will explain:



• An usher or greeter will let you know when to leave your seat



- Everyone must exit the pew to avoid people stepping over others. If you are not going to receive Communion, please cross your arms over your chest and bow your head when approaching the Eucharistic Minister.
 - Marks on the floor will assist you in maintaining 6 foot distance. Those with whom you are domiciled can remain closer if you wish.
- When 12 feet (2 people away) from the presider, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces.
 - When you approach the presider or minister, DO NOT remove your mask.
 - Extend a single hand to receive the host.
 - Move 6 feet to the right or left (there is an X on the floor) then remove your face covering and consume the host. We encourage those who may need help with this to be assisted by those with whom they are domiciled.
 - Replace the face covering and return to your pew.

AFTER THE SERVICE

You will be dismissed by the pew or seating area to preserve social distancing in the aisles. Follow the instructions of the usher.

Please use only the designated exit doors.

Do not congregate outside the church doors or in the parking lots.

Continue to wear your face covering until you have left the church.


PLEASE NOTE

CELEBRATION OF SACRAMENTS AND SERVICES IN PHASE 2

We are excited to be expanding the guidelines for celebration of the Sacraments and other services at St. Francis Xavier. See the separate article in this bulletin for information on Sunday Mass.

Reconciliation will continue to be celebrated on Saturday mornings from 9-10AM in the lower Unity Hall vestibule. Enter from the parking lot through the courtyard between the church and education buildings. While waiting, please observe the outside markings for social distancing and wear a mask. In bad weather, wait in your car until the prior person leaves the vestibule.

Baptisms. We continue to celebrate Baptisms on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons for one child at a time. Beginning July 18, 25 people can be in attendance. All those attending must register <u>in advance</u> with the parish office and provide names and contact information. Masks, and social distancing requirements for those who do not share a home, remain in place. Contact the parish office to schedule a Baptism.

Marriages. Wedding ceremonies have a limit of 90 people in attendance. All those attending must be registered <u>in advance</u> through the bride and groom. The opening procession is limited to the bride and whoever will accompany her down the aisle. Masks, and social distancing requirements for those who do not share a home, remain in place.

Funeral Masses. As of July 15, Funeral Masses have a limit of 90 people in attendance. All those attending must register <u>in advance</u> through the family or the parish online reservation system. All except for the immediately family will be escorted to a designated seat <u>before</u> the Funeral Mass begins. Masks, and social distancing requirements for those who do not share a home, remain in place.

Holy Hour of Adoration. The Holy Hour of Adoration is celebrated on the third Thursday of the month. All those attending must register <u>in advance</u> through the parish online reservation system. Masks, and social distancing requirements for those who do not share a home, remain in place.

Weekday Mass/ Private Prayer. Weekday Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday and Friday at 8:30 AM. The church will be open for one hour of private prayer on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:30-9:30AM. All those attending must be registered <u>in advance</u> through the parish online reservation system. Masks, and social distancing requirements for those who do not share a home, remain in place.

Anointing of the Sick. Fr. Bill must refer a request to anoint someone who has tested positive or is suspected of having contracted COVID-19 to one of the priests that have been designated to perform these anointings. Fr. Bill remains available for <u>all other anointings</u> following established safety guidelines. The first step in requesting the Anointing of the Sick is to contact the rectory.

Dear SFX Parents,

As many of you may have heard Governor Pritzker made an announcement on Tuesday, June 23, 2020, that K-12 schools, community colleges and higher education can resume in-person instruction if they follow new guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19

The Illinois Department of Health (IDPH) guidelines for schools to reopen in Phase 4, which the state is expected to enter in to Friday, include:

- Require use of appropriate personal protective equipment, including face coverings;
- Prohibit more than 50 individuals from gathering in one space;
- Require social distancing whenever possible;
- Conduct symptom screenings and temperature checks or require self-certification that individuals entering school buildings are symptom free; and
- · Increase school-wide cleaning and disinfection

The Illinois State Board of Education (SBE) also released a Part 3 to the Starting of the School Year 20-21 document yesterday afternoon. This document takes into consideration the information from the IDPH. As we unpack this document, we are also waiting for the Archdiocese to release their guidelines soon. We have our teams in place, we have begun looking at all aspects of our protocols and expectations to see how these guidelines can be implemented at St. Francis. Our priorities throughout the planning are to keep our students, safe, healthy, and learning in school.

Governor Pritzker also stated that if there is a dramatic decline in local health metrics or a second wave of COVID-19, schools will need to return to remote instructions. Pritzker says schools also have the flexibility to do a combined version of in-person instruction and remote learning.

Our plan, as of today, is to reopen school for grades K-8 on August 19th with in-person instruction. ("We may need to revise our preschool 1st day schedule.) Our teams are also planning for the possibility of returning to remote learning if necessary. As decisions are made we will try to keep our parents informed in a timely manner with most information coming in August. As we have all seen the past few months the information can change daily. We appreciate your support as we remain hopeful that we will be able to welcome our students into school in August. We look forward to a positive 20-21 school year!

Scripture Reflection

Only seed that sinks into rich soil—our very hearts—can produce fruit. Our daily Gospel living is about tilling and fertilizing and constantly preparing the "soil" of our hearts so that we can receive Jesus' seed-word and nature it to bear fruit. We must let Jesus' seed-word sink deep within us so that it can bear fruit in our daily living., "achieving the end for which [God] sent it!"

A challenging remark that moves us to new action on behalf of others, a critical remark that causes us to look at our own behavior and choices, a kind remark that brings us joy are all ways God's word comes to us, and ways we can sow the seed of God's word in the hearts of others.
