

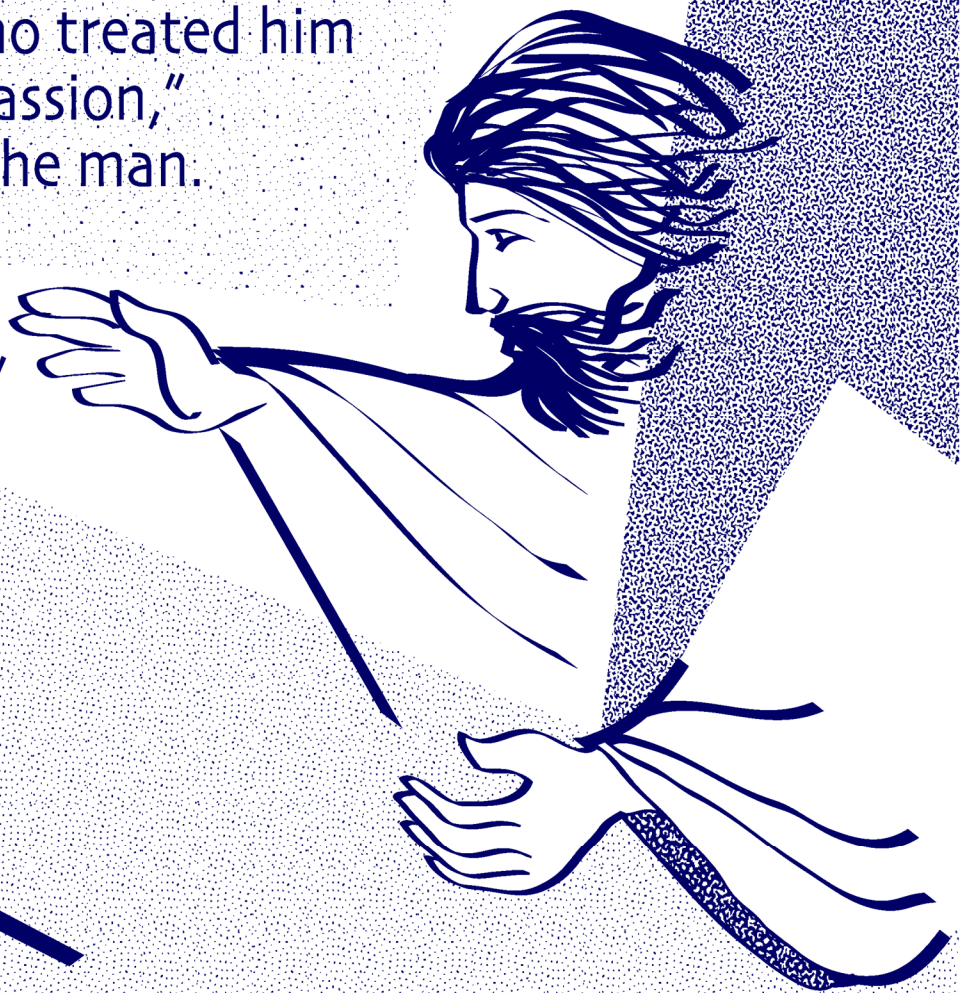

Scripture Reflections

Sometimes those who need to be helped want help on their own terms. But today's gospel is a reminder that to those in the ditch, help may come from the most unforeseen or even unimaginable people. When we place limitations on even such things as who might lend us help or assistance, we might not be open to the mercy of God, which is extended in a variety of ways. Though this parable of the Good Samaritan is often read in a way so that we are open to receive mercy and kindness from others, no matter who they might be. Jesus invites us to move beyond ourselves in moments of crisis and to be open to mercy from wherever it might come. In doing so, we die to our own preconceived notions and live anew with an openness broader than we had before. For if we in the ditch are not willing to see the Samaritan as a neighbor, and accept his act of mercy, we will surely die in that same ditch.

Our Berghaus Pipe Organ

I am pleased to announce that we are a couple of steps closer to completing the original vision of our beautiful pipe organ built in 2003 by Berghaus Pipe Organ, Bellwood, IL. The installation of the full plan for our pipe organ was cut short due to boiler problems in 2003. Some of the allocated funds for the organ had to be moved to fix the boiler, leaving the installation of the organ incomplete.

Thanks to the support of a parishioner's generous monetary gift, we now have the prepared *Rauschpfeife III* and *Clarion* stops completed and installed. My sincere gratitude and thanks to that parishioner, who wishes to remain anonymous.

Full completion of the installation plan would involve adding two final elements: *Chimes* and the *Trompette Royale*. This beautiful instrument will continue to enhance our worship for years to come. Thank you!

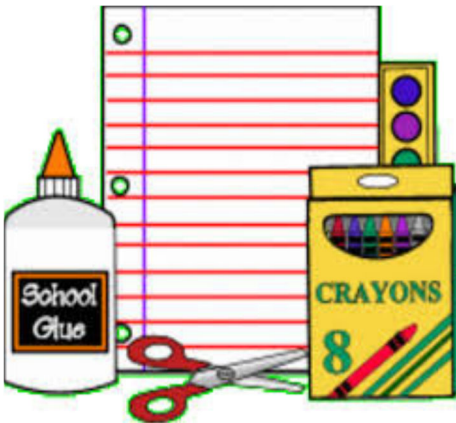

Fiscal Year Report of Collections from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019

Total Collections for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019:	\$1,842,411
Budget:	\$1,900,000

Our fiscal year offertory increased 1% over last year's, short of our budgeted increase of 4% to break even. In the upcoming months we will provide more information about how this affects our financial position.

We are in the process of revising our budget for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, which began July 1st. Until this has been finalized and reviewed by the Finance Council in early September, we will not be reporting actual collections versus budget.

Finding Balance: The Art of Rock Balancing on Tuesday, July 16 from 9:00-11:30 am with Facilitator Carol Hohle. Experience the connection and harmony that comes from finding just the right way to balance one rock on another. From cairns to arches to near-point balance we'll play, arrange, and cultivate patience and sensitivity. Cost: \$25.

"13th" Movie screening and discussion on Saturday, July 20 from 1:00-4:00 pm. Just think, slavery would have been abolished in 1865 by the 13th Amendment (hence the film's title), but for one small clause that all but grandfathered slavery back in for the sake of crime and punishment. This powerful and infuriating documentary explores the history of racial inequality in the United States, focusing on the fact that the nation's prisons are disproportionately filled with African-Americans. Cost: Free will offering.

Thomas Berry: A Biography—a discussion with Mary Evelyn Tucker and John Grim on Wednesday, July 24 from 7:00-8:30 pm. Thomas Berry (1914-2009) was one of the 20th Century's most profound and forward-thinking "geologists", who sought to replace the modern alienation from nature with a sense of intimacy and responsibility. Mary Evelyn Tucker and John Grim teach at Yale University, where they direct the Forum on Religion and Ecology. They knew Thomas Berry well, edited his books, and co-authored the first biography of this great man. Cost: \$20 (the book will be available at this program).

Life-Changers: The Gospel According to Hildegard and Julian of Norwich on Saturday, August 3 from 9:30 am-3:30 pm with Facilitator Mark Burrows. G. K. Chesterton once commented that the saint each age most needs is the one who contradicts it most. Hildegard and Julian of Norwich were such persons. Christian Meditation at St. John of the Cross

Christian Meditation is a contemplative spiritual discipline which is similar to Centering Prayer, or sometimes referred to as "prayer of the heart". This prayer is not new—for centuries it had been lost in our Catholic faith, especially for lay people; but is for all who want to live more fully in the Spirit of God.

How To Meditate

Sit still and upright in a quiet place with feet flat on the floor and hands in lap or on knees.

Let go of any expectations or demands. Just Be.

Gently close your eyes and silently, interiorly begin to say a single prayer word. The word recommended is Ma-ra-na-tha (Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke), meaning "Come, Lord".

Continue repeating the word during the entire time of meditation. Whenever distractions come, gently return your attention to the word, without judging or analyzing. It is recommended to meditate 20-30 minutes twice a day.

Words from some of the meditators:

"After meditating for some time I began noticing subtle, yet very real changes in the way I was feeling and responding to life situations—more open, peaceful, compassionate, and less reactive. Being part of a group at SJC helps me to be more faithful to the daily practice."

"Something which keeps me going with meditation is the knowledge that the important thing is to be faithful to the practice. Our God wants us all to be in closer union with Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Meditation is a way for me to seek that union, and a great thing about it is that anyone can do it."

All are welcome to any of the 4 weekly groups for Christian Meditation in the Parish Center, Room 7. Meetings last 45 to 55 minutes, and no experience is necessary.

Infant Baptisms

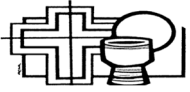

Parish Counselor

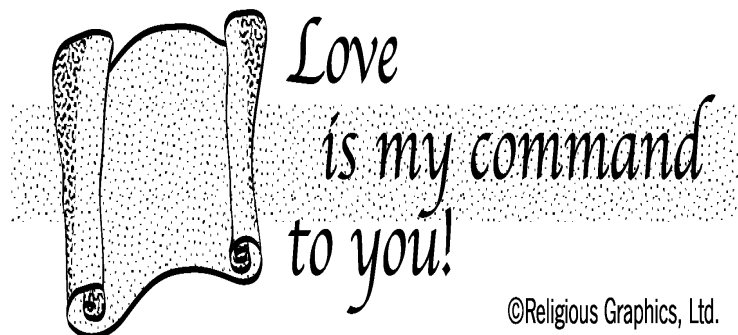
