



Pastor's Notes



Scripture Reflection

Jesus satisfies human needs. The story tells us that the crowds followed Jesus because they saw the signs he did on those who were diseased. After witnessing another sign they will recognize him as a prophet. The recognition on the part of the crowd is based on Jesus satisfying human needs.

We can be reminded of family life and dealing with children. Often as long as all needs (and wants) are met things can seem to be going along well. The children are satisfied. We will see later in this same chapter of John that Jesus asks something of the crowds and most abandon him. It's easy to follow Jesus when we are on the receiving end of his bounty and goodness. It's easy for children to be happy when they are on the receiving end of parents' bounty and goodness. But what happens when the crowds are asked to make a commitment? What happens when family members are asked to step up and take some responsibility?

Growing in adult discipleship means that there will come a time (if it hasn't come already) when we will no longer be simply on the receiving end of the relationship. We will be called to enter further into a relationship with Jesus that is more mutually reciprocal, though Jesus will always be the teacher and we will always be in the position of disciples. Jesus will call the crowds closer to the circle with him. It's easy to be a follower, or a member of the crowd receiving goodies. Soon, those crowds will be invited to go deeper.





Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie Day Trip– Wilmington, IL on Friday, August 10 from 9:45 am-3:00 pm. Imagine walking through a field of tallgrass prairie 10 feet tall! We'll do this at Midewin, a 20,000 acre experiment in prairie restoration, where a herd of bison was introduced as a way to help restore a native tallgrass ecosystem on a site dominated by decaying WWII munitions structures and roads. Nothing remotely on this scale or complexity has ever been attempted before! A ranger from the U.S. Forest Service will guide our hike through this healing landscape of grasslands, savanna, wetlands and seeps, upland forests and streams. The LaGrange Area Ministerium

For more than 30 years, clergy members lay leaders from various faith communities in and around LaGrange have gathered monthly to share resources and address current issues. St. Francis Xavier Church is one of approximately 20 faith communities involved.

Most recently, members of the Ministerium have been working to provide a just wage to low income workers, the option of pre-school education for all children, housing for the homeless, support for low income residents in an assisted living facility under less than adequate management, and a summer Community Peace Camp for children ages 4-14.

Annual prayer opportunities, which often feature music by a combined choir, include: a Thanksgiving Community Service in November, a Good Friday Community Service prior to Easter, and the "All Together Under the Son" in August (morning prayer to kick off the Sunday of "Endless Summerfest"). The Thanksgiving and Good Friday services have been hosted for many years. The "All Together Under the Son" service began in 2016, following the wonderful success of the SFX 125th Anniversary Outdoor Mass a year earlier.


DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OUTREACH — ARCHDIOCESE & CHICAGO — AWARENESS - SERVICES - PREVENTION

Parish Counselor


