Pastor's Letter

"If anyone comes to me without loving me above all else, they cannot be my disciple." Luke 14:26

Why would Jesus ask us to hate? In today's gospel, we hear Jesus say, "Whoever comes to me without hating their father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even their own life, cannot be my disciple." You might say, "This must be a mistake or a poor translation." However, in the time of Jesus, love and hate defined two exclusive options. If you committed to love someone or something above all else, you must then "hate" everything else; you must let go of any attachment to all else. Jesus says this as he approaches Jerusalem, where he will face suffering and death. He asks his followers to understand that only by placing love of God above all else will they be able to journey with him through suffering and death to new life. They, and we, must let go of our hold on anything else in our lives that would cause us to hesitate.

What competes with my love of God and commitment to Christ's mission? What are the signs that someone or something else has taken God's place? In my own life, I come to see that I am bargaining with God. "If only you let me have this one thing, I will not ask for anything else." "If only you will take away his stubbornness, or cure her illness, or give this family what they are asking." "If only you give me one more year before things change, or help me get those tickets, or ensure that I get everything done on time." Whenever I place expectations on God based on *the world as I would have it*, I am choosing to love someone or something more than God.

Autumn was a time for many of our ancestors to take inventory. Facing the potential harshness of the winter months ahead, they had to decide what to preserve and what to let go of to make room for what was essential. This also is true in living our mission as disciples of Christ. I am called to be a witness to my trust in God's love and care above all else. What do I need to keep close to me; what do I need to hold more loosely or perhaps give away? Am I willing to separate my "wants" from my "needs" to serve God above all else? Am I willing to place God's direction for my life and my community before ideology or politics or ethnicity or even the most just cause? How might our lives be changed if we take a searching and fearless inventory of our lives and release our hold of all that stands between us and God?

Father Larry Dowling, pastor of our sharing parish, was asked to offer a Labor Day reflection. He writes that, in recent years,

"We learned a lot about ourselves, our public health safeguards, and our interconnectedness with "essential workers." In addition to the tireless first responders on the front lines, we deepened our awareness of our dependence on food production workers, drivers, workers who provide in-home care, etc. As we pulled back the curtain on our economic systems during the pandemic, we realized that the workers who kept us safe and comfortable were the lowest-paid and the most poorly treated workers, most often immigrant and African American workers... There is a sacred link between our faith, our work, and the workers who make our lives possible. With the grace of God, may those links be strengthened that those who steward our businesses (and all of us) may more and more recognize their sacred responsibility to respect the dignity and sanctity of workers, providing wages, benefits and a work environment that honors them and their families! Happy Labor Day!"

The Senior Women's Group is pleased to have Joan Stopka as a speaker on Tuesday, September 13, 2022 in Unity Hall immediately following 8:30am Mass. Joan will tell us about her volunteer involvement in one of the ministries of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Taller de José (Joseph's Workshop). Taller was established to place the clients in contact with the resources that they need to help with their daily lives. An additional step, unique to Taller, is that when necessary they accompany the clients to their appointments.

Joan has been a parishioner of St Francis for 51 years. She taught Spanish for 38 years before her retirement from Lyons Township High School. She has been a compañera (companion) at Taller de José for 11 years.

Everyone is welcome to join. It is a time to renew old acquaintances and meet new friends. All are welcome. Light refreshment will be offered.

...But what is the SENIOR WOMEN'S GROUP?

The group was started in 2011 by Nancy Morgan and Joan Cushing. We provide an opportunity to gather with women we have not seen for a while *OR* to learn the names of women we have seen many times but don't really know *OR* to get acquainted with women who are new to the parish.

The group meets four times a year. One meeting during Advent or Lent is spiritual in nature. Two meetings are open with general topics of interest. In May there is luncheon, although from 2020-2022 COVID prevented this celebration.

September 3: Feast of St. Phoebe



I commend to you our sister Phoebe, [diakonos] of the church at Cenchreae. Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 16:1

"Growing up, I never heard about St. Phoebe. She, like so many women of the early church, was lost to me for a long time...

Not until my late 20s do I recall Phoebe's name surfacing in my consciousness and even then, I couldn't place her beyond the heading "women of the early church." The reasons she remained in the shadows of my consciousness are as much a reflection of my own life and learning as of the institutions that have taught me and their conscious and unconscious influence on our wider perspectives as individuals and a church.

Phoebe appears in Paul's letter to the Romans, in which he exhorts the Romans: "I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church in Cenchreae." Paul writes, "I ask you to receive her in the Lord in a way worthy of his people and to give her any help she may need from you, for she has been the benefactor of many people, including me" (Romans 16:1-2).

Brief though it is, this introduction is full of import. In these two

verses, Paul provides critical information about the woman he has entrusted to deliver his letter to Rome.

Calling her sister, deacon and benefactor, Paul signals that Phoebe is his co-worker in the kingdom. He has chosen her to convey his message and it is his hope that they, like her, will come to believe and to support the Christian mission. By identifying Phoebe as a deacon, Paul indicates that she was a preacher and teacher of the faith and gives us the earliest written record of women's ordained ministry in the church..."

Year of St. Phoebe: Sep 3, 2022 – Sep 3, 2023

<u>Discerning Deacons</u>, whose mission is to engage Catholics in the active discernment of our Church about women and the diaconate, this weekend inaugurated the "Year of St. Phoebe." Throughout this year, St. Francis will prayerfully listen and discern with the Holy Spirit on the topic of women in the diaconate, ultimately contributing our communal voice to the conversation happening in light of a papal commission on the issue.

One of our tasks is simply to watch for the places where women in our parish community "actually carry out the functions of the deacon's office, either preaching the word of God as catechists, or presiding over scattered Christian communities in the name of the pastor and the bishop, or practicing charity in social or relief work." (*Ad gentes*, 16)
