## **Pastor's Letter**

The Pharisees and the scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Luke 15:1

In the east transept niche, you will see a copy of a painting that has been there for several months, while a new frame made by a parishioner is treated before installation. Many have asked, "Where did that come from? I have never seen it before." The reproduction Rembrandt's painting depicts the moment when the Prodigal Son is welcomed home by his father and has been in our parish Reconciliation Room for many years. It is perhaps the best known of three parables that Jesus offers in response to the complaints of the scribes and Pharisees in today's gospel. Jesus reveals that the true relationship of God the Father to the sinner is one of loving acceptance.

How often I have heard the person coming to the Sacrament of Reconciliation express their fears that God will not forgive the sin they have come to confess, or that God has not yet forgiven a sin they confessed long ago. Perhaps there are many who avoid the individual celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation for fear that they will encounter God's judgment rather than mercy. Some, when young, may have been led to believe in a God who kept track of their sins and failings and would punish them one day. And, sadly, some encountered a priest in Reconciliation who failed in his ministry to speak words of healing and left the penitent feeling more guilty than loved as they walked away from this Sacrament of spiritual healing.

The message of Jesus is simple. God loves us. God forgives our sins the very moment we commit them, no matter how serious the sin. We confess our sins not so that God will forgive us; we confess our sins to acknowledge our need for, and open our hearts to, the forgiveness that God already has offered us. God does not hold our sins, past or present, over our heads in condemnation. Our God is the father of the Prodigal Son; a loving parent who waits patiently and expectantly for our return to his embrace. He does not need our prepared speech, but only the sincerity of our hearts. He does not punish, but rather replaces the dirt and rags of our wayward journey with fine clothing and throws a banquet to celebrate our return.

The parable of the Prodigal Son is not a story of a "single chance" to be forgiven and to begin anew. The father in the parable must know that this younger son is a wanderer and may wander away again. And he will embrace his son however many times his son returns to him and celebrate that return. This story is also a message for those who would judge themselves more worthy of God's love than another. At the end of the parable, the elder son stands out in the cold and dark, his heart hardened by bitterness and resentment. The father pleads for him to join the celebration. The only thing preventing the elder son from experiencing the father's love is the hardness of his own heart. The parable begs us not to stand with him in the cold darkness of a stony heart.

God loves us. God forgives us right away, no matter what! Are we willing to be messengers of this good news to others by accepting God's loving forgiveness into our own hearts and allowing God's forgiveness to flow through us to those who are hurting or afraid? Will we come in from the cold and be part of the celebration!

## FAQ on Offertory:

How did our offertory do last fiscal year? SFX Parish met our Sunday, Easter, and Christmas combined budget of \$1.74 million! Alleluia!

**What's the recommended increase for this year?** The Finance Council recommended a 5% increase to the pastor. Due to increased expenses such as the addition of the youth minister, regular salaries and benefits, and Elementary School support, this fiscal year's budget is based on a 5% increase and the use of approximately \$170,000 in cash reserves. More on this in our Annual Report, which will come out in November.

What was our highest offertory reached in the past 5 years? In the year ending June 30, 2019, our offertory totaled \$1.84 million.

**How do people usually give?** About half of those who give regularly to the parish give electronically or through various investment vehicles. The other half of those who give regularly use the Sunday offertory envelope.

**Have you ever considered a children's offertory program?** In the upcoming month, Elis Guidice, our Director of Religious Education, will be implementing a children's offertory curriculum into the Elementary School and the School of Religious Education. You will hear more about this in the weeks to come.

## Parish Open Position: Facility Manager

We are looking to hire a new Facility Manager with the retirement of Frank Roccasalva this fall. The Facility Manager reports directly to the pastor and is an integral member of the parish staff. He or she manages our building operating systems and routine maintenance of all parish facilities. They have oversight of all contractor and purchasing contracts to achieve the smooth operation of the parish's daily logistical requirements. Some examples of duties include:

- Monitor and manage routine/preventative maintenance of the parish buildings, grounds, and equipment, including but not limited to HVAC systems, plumbing, electrical, phone systems, and building security.
- Supervise parish custodian staff and external custodial services for all campus buildings.
- Interact with the Elementary School Principal and Director of Religious Education to enhance the learning environment in the Education Building
- Manage work orders for parish events and group meetings in collaboration with the event group contacts, and direct custodial services to prepare for and work at the events as needed.

- Visit the family and friends of the deceased at the wake to offer support and prayer on behalf of their parish community.
- Conduct the wake service if needed or requested by the bereaved family.
- Serve as a greeter, lector or Eucharistic Minister at the funeral liturgy if needed or requested by the family.
- Attend occasional prayer sessions and on -going formation to support the ministry.
