

#### TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS – SUNDAY AND WEEKDAY MASSES

<u>We are grateful that we can gather for Mass again!</u> Please remember that all present will have varying degrees of comfort with the situation. Do not take offense at any gesture, or lack thereof. Please understand the need of our volunteers to require certain things of you about which we have no choice. We ALL gather for one purpose to be in communion with God.

#### BEFORE YOU ARRIVE, YOU WILL NEED:

- ✓ A reservation via <u>www.sfxlg.org</u> or via a call to the parish office.
- ✓ A Mask or other covering for the mouth and nose.

#### WHEN YOU ARRIVE YOU MUST:

- ✓ Enter through the center door on Ogden Avenue (unless you indicated on your reservation that you need to use the Spring Avenue ramp).
- ✓ Keep your face covering or mask on at all times.
- ✓ Sanitize your hands as you enter.
- ✓ Observe social distancing at all times (look for green tape marks on floor).
- ✓ Sit in the location to which the greeters guide you. (Because of the need to manage seating distances, you are not able to choose your seat.

#### DURING THE SERVICE:

- ✓ Masks must be worn the entire time you are in the church.
- ✓ No physical sign of peace will be exchanged between those with whom you do not share living space (but gestures of peace are welcome!)
- ✓ A greeter will let you know when to leave your seat to receive Communion, and will offer a spray of hand sanitizer in preparation to receive the Host.
- ✓ Use the green tape marks on the floor to maintain a 6-foot distance from the person in front of you. (Those who share living space can remain closer if you wish.)
- ✓ With you mask on, extend a single hand to receive the host.
- ✓ Then move 6 feet to the right or left to the green X on the floor. Remove your mask and consume the host. (Adults may help others in their family who need assistance.) Replace your mask, and return to your seat.

#### AFTER THE SERVICE:

- ✓ Everyone must leave the church after the closing hymn.
- ✓ Follow the instructions of the greeters, who will invite people to leave one row at a time. Those in the body of the church will leave through the Ogden Avenue doors using the side aisles. Those in the side sections of the church will leave through the side doors.
- $\checkmark$  Please use only the designated exit doors.

#### PLEASE NOTE:

You will find a more detailed description of current procedures on the parish website. Our Parish Staff and volunteers will take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities and the Archdiocese. Please understand that you assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime you enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.

*Offerings:* If you do not contribute electronically at present, please use boxes at the exits or the rectory mail slot to make your contribution. Thank you!

## **CELEBRATION OF SACRAMENTS AND SERVICES**

**Reconciliation** is celebrated on Saturday mornings from 9-10AM in the lower Unity Hall vestibule. Enter from the parking lot through the courtyard between the church and education buildings. While waiting, please observe the outside markings for social distancing and wear a mask. In bad weather, wait in your car until the prior person leaves the vestibule.

**Anointing of the Sick**. The office must refer a request to anoint someone who has tested positive or is suspected of having COVID-19 to one of the archdiocesan priests that have been designated to confer these anointings. Fr. Bill and Fr. Rich remain available for <u>all other anointings</u>, following established safety guidelines. Contact the parish office (708.352.0168) to arrange for an anointing. Our answering service can contact one of the priests in an emergency.

**For all remaining Sacraments and services**, masks are required, and social distancing must be maintained for those who do not share a living space.


**Baptisms.** We celebrate Baptisms on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons, one family at a time, with a limit of 25 people in attendance. All those attending must register <u>in advance</u> and provide names and contact information. Contact Missy Westerhoff (<u>mwesterhoff@sfxlg.org</u>) to schedule a Baptism.

**Marriages.** Wedding ceremonies are limited to 100 people in attendance. All attending must be registered <u>in advance</u> through the bride and groom. The opening procession is limited to the bride and whoever will accompany her down the aisle. Contact Maureen Pipal (<u>mpipal@sfxlg.org</u>) to schedule a wedding.

**Funeral Masses.** Funeral Masses are limited to 100 people in attendance. All those attending must register <u>in advance</u> through the family. All except for the immediately family will be escorted to a designated seat <u>before</u> the Funeral Mass begins.

**Holy Hour of Adoration.** A Holy Hour of Adoration is celebrated on the third Thursday of each month. All attending must register <u>in advance</u> through the parish website (<u>www.sfxlg.org</u>).

**Private Prayer.** The church is be open for one hour of private prayer on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:30-9:30AM. All those attending must be registered <u>in advance</u> through the parish online reservation system.

## THURSDAY MORNING COMMUNAL ROSARY

On Thursday mornings, our morning prayer hour will begin with a **Communal Rosary**, led by a group of parents of children in the parish elementary school. **All are welcome** to join them, but you are asked to register in advance via the parish website. When you sign up for the prayer on Thursday, you will see two options: Rosary at 8:15 and Morning Prayer at 9:00. The Rosary will begin sometime between 8:15 and 8:30. In good weather, the group will gather in the Mary Garden between the church and rectory. Otherwise the group will move into the church. Thank you to the mothers of our community who are making this prayer for available to all interested parishioners.

## VOLUNTEERS

We continue to recruit and train volunteers to provide support for all church services. This includes celebrations of Sunday and weekday Mass, Baptism, Marriage, and Funerals. We especially seek volunteers to wipe down pews after weekend Masses (including weddings and funerals). Preferred volunteers are between 15 and 65, in good health, and have no underlying health conditions. Volunteers can select the dates, times, and services for which they are available and willing to serve and will serve in a regular rotation from week to week or month to month. 

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Parishioners ask questions about why we do what we do at Mass under the current guidelines. Some also suggest changes to what we do. The parish Leadership Team takes parishioner feedback questions and concerns seriously and discusses how best to respond. This column will provide responses each week to some of the questions or concerns that arise.

# Why are all but one of the front pews empty?

Infectious disease experts suggest that it takes at least 15 minutes of continued contact for the coronavirus to be transmitted between two people wearing masks and standing within six feet of one another. We leave the front pew empty to create a greater "sense" of distance when people are walking across the front of three of the four sections of the church during Communion. It can "feel" too close to the person seated in that pew. The exception is the front pew on the east (Spring Avenue) side of the church. The only persons who are seated in this pew are the lector and communion minister, who both need easy access to the altar area. In the beginning, we encouraged each minister to invite their entire family to However, larger families sit with them. created a sense of being too close for those passing them after receiving communion. To address this perception, we have reduced the maximum number of people in this pew to the two ministers and one additional person each, or a maximum of four people.

Despite the many difficulties this year and whatever may lie ahead, our parishioners continue to support SFX with their time in prayer, talents in our ministries, and their financial resources.

We are in the process of revising our school budget for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, which began July 1st. Until this has been finalized and reviewed by the School Advisory Board and the Finance Council this month, we will not be reporting actual collections versus budget.

## **DIGGING A WELL IN AFRICA**



The Brothers of Charles Lwanga, the focus of our Summer Mission Appeal, wrote of their project to dig wells in sub-Saharan Africa to provide clean water for children and their families in areas in which surface water often is unsafe for drinking. We chose this group based on the strong recommendation of Fr. Stan IIo for the work of this community of indigenous religious brothers.

A parishioner has offered to make a very generous contribution toward the completion of one of these wells by *matching, <u>dollar for dollar</u>, parishioner contributions to this project*. This solar operated well will serve over 1,000 villagers. The total cost for the project is \$34,000, and construction from start to finish will take only one month.

Bishop Eduardo Hiiboro Kussala of the Diocese of Tombura-Yambio responded to this offer with these words. We thank you for such exceptional keen attention you have paid towards the poor in my diocese. Surely, when the water point will be completed, you see (sic) the celebration and of course the prayers for you and all the collaborators in this regard. Be sure of my prayers for you all!

We have established a Quicklink to GiveCentral on the parish website for all who are able and willing to meet this challenge and bring clean water to a village in Africa. <u>Or</u> you can write a check to the parish designated to "Dig a Well." This is an opportunity to reach "well" beyond our borders and provide a basic necessity to our sisters and brothers in another part of the world we share.
