Saint Paul writes to Timothy of the importance healthy relationship of а between the community of faith and the civil authorities. He insists that Christians must be good citizens of the lands in which they live and must pray for those in authority. And he does so within a in which Christians social order faced punishment, loss of privilege, or even execution because of their beliefs. Paul himself would become a martyr because of his preaching and ministry.

For two millennia, Christians have struggled with the tension between civil authority and Christian witness. The call of the gospel sends disciples of Jesus to work for justice and peace and to care for all as our sisters and brothers, especially those most in need. Yet this is not always reflected in our civil laws, institutions, or attitudes. Nor is it possible for a civil society comprised of many religious traditions to enshrine the values of any one of them. Christians even disagree among or within ourselves as to what laws, institutions, and attitudes best reflect the gospel message of Jesus.

So, what is Paul asking of us? What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus in a pluralistic society? It seems to me that Paul is calling for First, within the two things. Christian community, we must strive for communion among the diversity of voices and perspectives within our own community. We must be willing to listen to one another, holding the gospel as our touchstone and allowing God to guide our discernment as to what the gospel is asking of us in the specific circumstances of our time and place. Second, we must be a people who speak for the common good, working toward consensus rather than dissension. Paul asks that our prayer for those in authority is with the hope "that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity."

This is never an easy task. The ability to listen to another with an open mind and heart is, I believe, not only a skill but a virtue. Perhaps this is even more challenging in a time in which those at the extremes select or manufacture the facts that support their beliefs, and in which the actions of many have led us to mistrust persons in authority. I imagine that many who are reading this have decided which "side" I am on and to whom I am referring. That only emphasizes the challenge of being a person of faith today.

Are we willing to be voices that lower the temperature of civil discourse and do the hard work to separate fact from opinion? Are we willing to listen to and learn from those who hold positions seemingly opposed to our own? Are we willing to speak up or quietly walk away when a conversation becomes unkind, disrespectful, or divisive?

Those of you who have come to know me know that I face an inner struggle in moments of conflict. It is not always easy for me to listen rather than to form the arguments in my mind that will prove the other wrong. I have been praying for the grace to be able to be quiet, listen, and learn when I am tempted to do the opposite. Paul himself was not always the model of what he preaches. We rely on a loving God who will work in and through us if we are willing to let God in.

God bless our country and those who serve in positions of leadership and authority. God bless us with the willingness to listen and learn from one another.

#### FAQ on Offertory:

How did our offertory do last fiscal year? SFX Parish met our Sunday, Easter, and Christmas combined budget of \$1.74 million! Alleluia!

**What's the recommended increase for this year?** The Finance Council recommended a 5% increase to the pastor. Due to increased expenses such as the addition of the youth minister, regular salaries and benefits, and Elementary School support, this fiscal year's budget is based on a 5% increase and the use of approximately \$170,000 in cash reserves. More on this in our Annual Report, which will come out in November.

What was our highest offertory reached in the past 5 years? In the year ending June 30, 2019, our offertory totaled \$1.84 million.

**How do people usually give?** About half of those who give regularly to the parish give electronically or through various investment vehicles. The other half of those who give regularly use the Sunday offertory envelope.

**Have you ever considered a children's offertory program?** In the upcoming month, Elis Guidice, our Director of Religious Education, will be implementing a children's offertory curriculum into the Elementary School and the School of Religious Education. You will hear more about this in the weeks to come.

## Parish Open Position: Facility Manager

We are looking to hire a new Facility Manager with the retirement of Frank Roccasalva this fall. The Facility Manager reports directly to the pastor and is an integral member of the parish staff. He or she manages our building operating systems and routine maintenance of all parish facilities. They have oversight of all contractor and purchasing contracts to achieve the smooth operation of the parish's daily logistical requirements. Some examples of duties include:

- Monitor and manage routine/preventative maintenance of the parish buildings, grounds, and equipment, including but not limited to HVAC systems, plumbing, electrical, phone systems, and building security.
- Supervise parish custodian staff and external custodial services for all campus buildings.
- Interact with the Elementary School Principal and Director of Religious Education to enhance the learning environment in the Education Building.
- Manage work orders for parish events and group meetings in collaboration with the event group contacts, and direct custodial services to prepare for and work at the events as needed.

- Attend occasional prayer sessions and on -going formation to support the ministry.

We have begun the process of discerning three or four parishioners who will enhance the diversity of parish voices on the PPC.

According to the guidelines, PPC members serve a two-year term and can ask to remain on the PPC for an additional one or two years. A member then must step away from the PPC for at least five years. This allows us to continue to involve new voices.
