

Pastor's Notes

*Where do the conflicts among you come from?
The fruit of righteousness is sown in peace.*
James 4:1, 3:18

The apostle James answers his question before he asks it. So, I have cited the above scripture verses in reverse order. He identifies a range of human weaknesses that produce conflicts between individuals, groups, and nations. We tend to want what we want when we want it, without regard for the cost to others. We are like the little child in the grocery store who pleads for the bright candy wrapper without a sense of its nutritional value or the family budget. We become jealous of what someone else has, even if we had no desire to have it until we saw that another person did. We may expend great effort to obtain something, well beyond its value. We may even risk addiction to have something we think we will die without, without regard to the harm to ourselves and others.

Saint James teaches us that *we must be at peace* with ourselves, with others, with creation, and with God. This demands the deep faith that God has given us everything we need and more to live in peace in *this* moment. We may have experienced the peaceful feeling of being among those who are content with who they are and what they have, even though it is “below the standards” of their family or neighbors. We may have those moments when all is well in our world with no thought of what is “lacking.” As I head to my silent retreat in Colorado this Sunday afternoon, I seek to know gratitude for the graces in my life and a sense of how God wants me to use them. I will ask to be released from that which I think I need or want to have, so that I can experience the peace and gratitude of being with what is.

James challenges us to reflect on what our children and youth see and hear in us. As we heard from his letter last weekend, “Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead.” Does our relationship to the things of this world reflect gratitude for what we have received? Or do our words and actions express a discontent with


what is and an ongoing effort to acquire more? Do we seek lives rooted in peace with self, others, things, and God? Or have we been seduced by the desire for more and better so that our lives have become a constant competition with the world around us?

Last Sunday, a parishioner approached me with a solution to our air conditioning problem. Rather than graciously receiving her suggestion, I “needed to explain” that another expert already had diagnosed the problem. I “wanted to defend myself and prove” that I was doing my job. In the process, I brought anything but peace to either one of us. I soon regretted my words; but she already had left. Since I did not know her by name, I could only pray that God would restore the peace that I selfishly had taken from her that day.

Jesus challenges us to receive with love the child in our midst who has little to give but love. The laughter, bursts of sound, and unexpected actions of our youngest members, when they are among us for worship, are God’s gift to us. They bring a smile to my face and joy to my heart in their honest expression of where they are in the moment. If only we could learn to see one another in the same way. May we all learn the way to *the peace of this moment* and become instruments of God’s peace for others.

Weekend Mass Updates at St. Francis Xavier!

The CDC has revised its recommendations on wearing masks in indoor, public spaces, following evidence that the COVID delta strain can spread rapidly even among fully vaccinated individuals. The parish Leadership Reopening Team has determined how we will respond to provide the safest possible environment for all who worship at St. Francis Xavier.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are now in effect.

- ◆ **Masks are required for everyone** over age 2, regardless of vaccination status.
- ◆ **We invite everyone to sing with your mask in place!** Pick up a bulletin as you enter church for the words to the hymns. As you leave, place any bulletins you are not taking home in the recycle baskets at each door.
- ◆ Please wait for an usher to invite your pew to come forward for communion. With your mask in place, receive the host in your hand and move six feet to the side before removing your mask to consume the host.

The following protocols remain unchanged.

- ◆ **All church doors remain open** for all worshippers.
- ◆ **Unity Hall remains open to families with small children** to offer a remote viewing option on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM and 11AM. This is only for families with small children and no cold symptoms.
- ◆ Every other pew in the back of church and in the east transept is not available for seating. These areas provide social distance for parents with infants, those with immune issues, and those not yet comfortable being closer than six feet. All other pews are available for general seating.
- ◆ Please avoid physical contact with those not of your own household, especially during the **Sign of Peace**. A nod or a wave is always appropriate.


