Pastor's Notes

The landowner said,
"Why do you stand here idle all day?"
They answered, "Because no one has hired us."
Matthew 20:6,7

The parish has completed a busy summer of catching up on Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, and Funerals that had been postponed when our parish church was closed. The administration, teachers, and facilities staff at our parish elementary school sacrificed vacation time to prepare to open safely with in-class learning, and our school of religious education has been developing a home-based program during the COVID restrictions. Our Food Pantry developed new systems that can continue into the winter months for Tuesday food distribution to an increasing number of area households. And we welcomed two new members of the pastoral staff, Fr. Rich Milek and Maggie McMahon, who have been busy connecting with parish leaders and developing new or revised programs in our virtual environment.

And then there is Election Season. Several parishioners have raised concerns about the tone of public conversation and our faith response in the face of harsh political rhetoric that includes insistence on how a "good Catholic" must vote. Amid the political turmoil, a pandemic has divided us on whether and when to wear a mask; renewed racial tensions have challenged us to explore more deeply the roots of racism in our society and the sometimes subtle ways in which racism infects systems to the benefit of some at the expense of others; and the instability of our economy has many more families among us living on the edge because of job loss or decreased household income.

So, what is our faith response to the tensions and rhetoric that attempts to divide us into opposing camps over the next two months? It seems to me that the landowner in today's gospel offers an important witness. When he encounters laborers seeming to be sitting idle in the town square, he does not judge them; rather, he asks why they are doing so. His willingness to ask, their honest response despite having been rejected all day, and his compassion for their situation offer both the landowner and the laborers an opportunity to grow in compassion and relationship.


At this point some of you may have taken my words as advocating for one political perspective over

another. And this is the challenge that we confront. Are we willing to ask questions and learn from one another how we come to different conclusions on the major issues of our day? Are we willing to acknowledge the instinctive judgments and biases that color our thoughts, no matter how open-minded we think we are? Are we willing to refuse to place God and Church within any political party and rather consider the moral values set forth by the bishops of this country for all of us to consider, even if they lead us to different conclusions when we apply them? Are we willing to be voices that seek to find our common ground and accept that no one of us has all the answers? Are we willing to place the common good above our personal interests and nurture relationships with those of other views whenever possible?

The faith response in an election season is to listen for the *voice of God* amid all the shouting and to build relationships among diverse perspectives. Our faith is echoed in the vision of our country's founders, which has continued to be perfected as we grow in understanding one another: *e pluibus unum* – from the many, one.

TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS - SUNDAY AND WEEKDAY MASSES

We are grateful that we can gather for Mass again! Please remember that all present will have varying degrees of comfort with the situation. Do not take offense at any gesture, or lack thereof. Please understand the need of our volunteers to require certain things of you about which we have no choice. We ALL gather for one purpose to be in communion with God.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE. YOU WILL NEED:

- ✓ A reservation via www.sfxlg.org or via a call to the parish office.
- ✓ A Mask or other covering for the mouth and nose.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE YOU MUST:

- ✓ Enter through the center door on Ogden Avenue (unless you indicated on your reservation that you need to use the Spring Avenue ramp).
- ✓ Keep your face covering or mask on at all times.
- ✓ Sanitize your hands as you enter.
- ✓ Observe social distancing at all times (look for green tape marks on floor).
- ✓ Sit in the location to which the greeters guide you. (Because of the need to manage seating distances, you are not able to choose your seat.

DURING THE SERVICE:

- ✓ Masks must be worn the entire time you are in the church.
- ✓ No physical sign of peace will be exchanged between those with whom you do not share living space (but gestures of peace are welcome!)
- ✓ A greeter will let you know when to leave your seat to receive Communion, and will offer a spray of hand sanitizer in preparation to receive the Host.
- ✓ Use the green tape marks on the floor to maintain a 6-foot distance from the person in front of you. (Those who share living space can remain closer if you wish.)
- ✓ With you mask on, extend a single hand to receive the host.
- ✓ Then move 6 feet to the right or left to the green X on the floor. Remove your mask and consume the host. (Adults may help others in their family who need assistance.) Replace your mask, and return to your seat.

AFTER THE SERVICE:

- ✓ Everyone must leave the church after the closing hymn.
- ✓ Follow the instructions of the greeters, who will invite people to leave one row at a time. Those in the body of the church will leave through the Ogden Avenue doors using the side aisles. Those in the side sections of the church will leave through the side doors.
- ✓ Please use only the designated exit doors.

PLEASE NOTE:

You will find a more detailed description of current procedures on the parish website.

Our Parish Staff and volunteers will take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities and the Archdiocese. Please understand that you assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime you enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.

Offerings: If you do not contribute electronically at present, please use boxes at the exits or the rectory mail slot to make your contribution. Thank you!

CELEBRATION OF SACRAMENTS AND SERVICES

Reconciliation is celebrated on Saturday mornings from 9-10AM in the lower Unity Hall vestibule. Enter from the parking lot through the courtyard between the church and education buildings. While waiting, please observe the outside markings for social distancing and wear a mask. In bad weather, wait in your car until the prior person leaves the vestibule.

Anointing of the Sick. The office must refer a request to anoint someone who has tested positive or is suspected of having COVID-19 to one of the archdiocesan priests that have been designated to confer these anointings. Fr. Bill and Fr. Rich remain available for <u>all other anointings</u>, following established safety guidelines. Contact the parish office (708.352.0168) to arrange for an anointing. Our answering service can contact one of the priests in an emergency.

For all remaining Sacraments and services, masks are required, and social distancing must be maintained for those who do not share a living space.


Baptisms. We celebrate Baptisms on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons, one family at a time, with a limit of 25 people in attendance. All those attending must register <u>in advance</u> and provide names and contact information. Contact Missy Westerhoff (<u>mwesterhoff@sfxlg.org</u>) to schedule a Baptism.

Marriages. Wedding ceremonies are limited to 100 people in attendance. All attending must be registered <u>in advance</u> through the bride and groom. The opening procession is limited to the bride and whoever will accompany her down the aisle. Contact Maureen Pipal (<u>mpipal@sfxlg.org</u>) to schedule a wedding.

Funeral Masses. Funeral Masses are limited to 100 people in attendance. All those attending must register <u>in advance</u> through the family. All except for the immediately family will be escorted to a designated seat before the Funeral Mass begins.

Holy Hour of Adoration. A Holy Hour of Adoration is celebrated on the third Thursday of each month from 6-7PM. All attending must register <u>in advance</u> through the parish website (<u>www.sfxlg.org</u>).

Private Prayer. The church is be open for one hour of private prayer on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:30-9:30AM. All those attending must be registered in advance through the parish online reservation system.

God bless you for your generosity to the Parish's many ministries, including education, youth, music, outreach, and more! Despite the many difficulties this year and whatever may lie ahead, our parishioners continue to support SFX with their time in prayer, talents in our ministries, and their financial resources.

We are in the process of revising our school budget for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, which began July 1st. Until this has been finalized and reviewed by the School Advisory Board and the Finance Council this month, we will not be reporting actual collections versus budget.

DIGGING A WELL IN AFRICA



The Brothers of Charles Lwanga, the focus of our Summer Mission Appeal, wrote of their project to dig wells in sub-Saharan Africa to provide clean water for children and their families in areas in which surface water often is unsafe for drinking. We chose this group based on the strong recommendation of Fr. Stan IIo for the work of this community of indigenous religious brothers.

A parishioner has offered to make a very generous contribution toward the completion of one of these wells by *matching, dollar for dollar, parishioner contributions to this project*. This solar operated well will serve over 1,000 villagers. The total cost for the project is \$34,000, and construction from start to finish will take only one month.

Bishop Eduardo Hiiboro Kussala of the Diocese of Tombura-Yambio responded to this offer with these words. We thank you for such exceptional keen attention you have paid towards the poor in my diocese. Surely, when the water point will be completed, you see (sic) the celebration and of course the prayers for you and all the collaborators in this regard. Be sure of my prayers for you all!

We have established a Quicklink to GiveCentral on the parish website for all who are able and willing to meet this challenge and bring clean water to a village in Africa. Or you can write a check to the parish designated to "Dig a Well." This is an opportunity to reach "well" beyond our borders and provide a basic necessity to our sisters and brothers in another part of the world we share.


