Pastor's Notes

*"Would that all the people
of the Lord were prophets!"*

Numbers 11:29

"But they didn't follow the rules! Why should they get the gift without doing all the work?" I can only speak for myself in confessing moments of resentment when others got the same reward without doing the work. I admit that sense of entitlement that keeps me from seeing all as a gift from a loving God, and so keeps me from an attitude of gratitude. I fail to notice the gifts that have come to me due to no merit of my own. I begin to think that I am more worthy than others; I fail to appreciate the gifts and effort others bring to the table. And I fail to encourage others and rejoice when their gifts come alive.

Such was the challenge Moses faced when the newly confirmed prophets resented two outside their company who had received the same gift. Moses confronts them with their failure to see their ability to prophesize as God's gift and not a reward based on their merits. He envisions a community in which all were open to God's gifts and able to see what God is doing in their midst. This year is a year of rebuilding for parish faith community. The risks of COVID are not abating as quickly as we had hoped, and so our forward movement has been slowed. We cannot yet open the campus to social events, large group meetings, or even our School of Religious

Education. Yet we can plan toward the day when all of this will be possible. In the meantime, we can connect with one another at church, in the community, or via virtual tools and social media. Prayers groups, scripture study, and other ministries remain alive and available. Our School of Religious Education has enhanced its virtual program to provide catechist guided sessions for each grade level; and Elis Guidice, our new DRE, is looking for opportunities to bring families together in smaller groupings. Our celebration of a full return to a new normal may be postponed; but our opportunities to grow in faith and to serve those in need remains vital. Strengthening our connection to others is the path to even greater vitality.

As you read this, I am well into my eight days of silent retreat in the foothills of the Colorado Rockies. It is a time of being present to the Lord and praying for the openness to hear God's desires for me. You are with me in my prayers, and I ask for yours.

May we be open to the unexpected prophets God places among us. May we recommit ourselves "to create a more just world through sacraments and worship, learning and service."

Blessing of Pets

October 4th is the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, who preached by his life God's call for us to care for all of creation. His feast day marks the beginning of a month in which we pray for a deepening commitment to healing our planet from the effects of climate change and a deeper respect for the sanctity of human life, from conception to natural death. The Feast of St. Francis also has been a time when we offer blessings to pets and renew our commitment to be good caretakers. St. Francis Xavier Parish will offer a Blessing of Pets **next Saturday**, October 2nd, at 10AM. We will gather on the Spring Avenue lawn along the east side of the church building. Pets of all types and sizes are welcome. (Speedy plans to attend.) Masks and social distancing will be required. Pass the word to friends and neighbors.

Weekend Mass Updates at St. Francis Xavier!

The CDC has revised its recommendations on wearing masks in indoor, public spaces, following evidence that the COVID delta strain can spread rapidly even among fully vaccinated individuals. The parish Leadership Reopening Team has determined how we will respond to provide the safest possible environment for all who worship at St. Francis Xavier.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are **now in effect**.

- ◆ **Masks are required for everyone** over age 2, regardless of vaccination status.
- ◆ **We invite everyone to sing with your mask in place!** Pick up a bulletin as you enter church for the words to the hymns. As you leave, place any bulletins you are not taking home in the recycle baskets at each door.
- ◆ Please wait for an usher to invite your pew to come forward for communion. With your mask in place, receive the host in your hand and move six feet to the side before removing your mask to consume the host.

The following protocols remain **unchanged**.

- ◆ **All church doors remain open** for all worshippers.
- ◆ **Unity Hall remains open to families with small children** to offer a remote viewing option on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM and 11AM. This is only for families with small children and no cold symptoms.
- ◆ Every other pew in the back of church and in the east transept is not available for seating. These areas provide social distance for parents with infants, those with immune issues, and those not yet comfortable being closer than six feet. All other pews are available for general seating.
- ◆ Please avoid physical contact with those not of your own household, especially during the **Sign of Peace**. A nod or a wave is always appropriate.

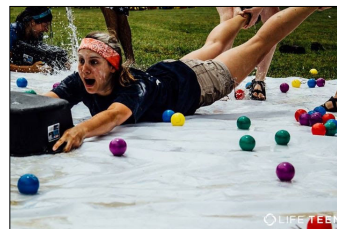

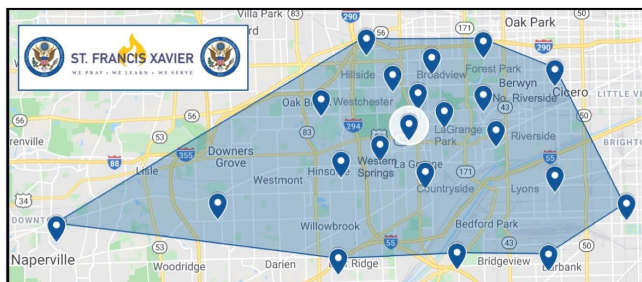

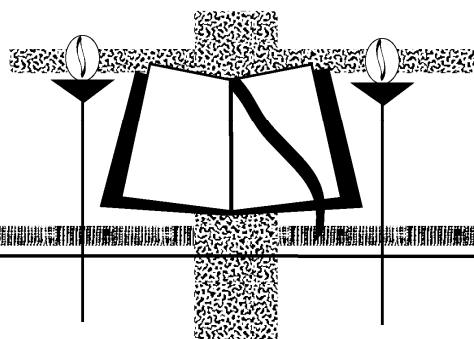
