

Pastor's Notes

"Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets!"

Numbers 11:29

Young Joshua is upset that two elders who "missed the meeting" nonetheless are prophesying. Moses challenges him to rejoice when God's Spirit comes alive in others rather than to limit the Spirit to set rituals or select individuals. God's Spirit seeks to live in <u>all</u> who will open their hearts and minds to let God speak through their words and actions. Imagine what our Sunday gatherings could be like if we each bring the Spirit of the Lord into our worship. Imagine how our places of work, study, play, and daily living might be transformed if we carry the Spirit from here into our words, attitudes, and actions in each moment.

This weekend we welcome into our prayer two voices of justice that confront our community and our nation. Simbul Siddiqui is a medical student in the MD-MPH program at Loyola University. She also is a DACA recipient, having been brought to this country as a child without the documentation that would allow her to become a citizen of the only country she has known. Simbul is sharing her story at the 9:00 and 10:30 Masses as part of a Chicago-area program in which Catholic and Jewish congregations are welcoming DACA recipients to provide a face and a voice to an issue that our country has yet to resolve. These young men and women do not advocate for a specific political solution. Rather, they have been invited to open our minds and hearts to the people behind the numbers. How might we encourage our elected leaders to find common ground to resolve the status of young people who hope and dream to share their talents with the country with which they identify and seek to serve?

October is a month in which we are called to deepen our awareness of several justice issues, including the *sanctity* of human life from conception to natural death and providing access to places of worship for all who live with physical or other disabilities. October also is a month to raise our awareness of domestic violence and abuse and to learn how to recognize and respond to situations of domestic violence in our families and neighborhoods. At each Mass this weekend, we welcome a member of our Domestic Violence Outreach Ministry to stir our engagement in an issue that affects 1 in 4 women in our society and many children and men. This is the sixth year for this ministry that serves in collaboration with St. Cletus and St. John of the Cross parishes.

How might <u>your</u> voice make a difference? Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Let us allow the Spirit to be a voice in the world through us.

A word of thanks to the women and men who provided two great opportunities to practice stewardship of time through gathering with parishioners at the recent Golf Outing and this weekend's Oktoberfest. Consider participating in this fall's remaining opportunities at the Parish Theater Night, the Men's Club Pig Roast, and the Falcon 5K!

Scripture Reflection

In the early years of the Christianity, from around 40 - 313 CE, leaders were chosen based upon the gifts the possessed. Men and women were invited to be teachers, preachers/story tellers, deacons or deaconesses, and presiders at Eucharistic meals based upon their faith, wisdom, and other gifts. Over the years, the Church made huge gains based upon family members, friends, teachers, leaders and mentors helping individuals recognize and develop their gifts for ministry. It had to do with lifting people up, and supporting them in freely sharing their gifts. Consider your own situation. What are your gifts, and how – and by whom - have you been invited to share them?

Today's gospel asks: "Who has a right to minister in Jesus' name?" His response: Anyone who can! It seems as though Jesus is far less interested in who receives the credit, than the action of carrying out great work. The goal has always been building the Kingdom of God.

Throughout the upcoming weeks, we will be invited to help build the Kingdom of God through the sharing of time, talent, and treasure here at St. Francis Xavier Church. May we all be about lifting one another up, and encouraging each other to freely share our gifts.

WHAT IS STEWARDSHIP?

Our willingness to...

Acknowledge the blessings we have in our lives
Reflect how we can continue to use our time, talents, and treasure
Act as Jesus' hands and feet in the world



Stewardship is acknowledging a life of abundance, whether you have lots of time and money or not! And really, how often do we run into a friend or family member that says, "Geez, I have so much time and money on my hands!" Right? Stewardship is realizing you are blessed in so many ways, and because of those blessings you are called to act generously and share. How can we live a stewardship way of life, a generous life, if we see our life through the lens of scarcity? How would your life look differently if we changed the view?

It is easy to sit here and write, "Be generous! Re-prioritize time to serve!" Do this, do that! I understand that lifestyle and culture changes take time. But here are just a few thoughts:

- Instead of thinking "no time," think about swapping "phone time" with prayer time. Each time you reach for that phone (often, when we are bored!) pray instead.
- Instead of thinking "no time for Mass- kids have plans!" just say "no." Make Sunday Mass the priority, one Sunday at a time.
- Instead of thinking "no money, can't contribute," start with loose change. Grab a piggy bank and start the loose change collection as a family, it is almost like a savings account for generosity!

It is easy to blame our absence or lack of charity on scarcity. But, I encourage you to explore abundance. Start small: you are here, present with us in prayer. For many around the world, *this* is a gift!



Come join us for Eucharistic Adoration! October 18, 2018 at 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT:

During Adoration, sometimes referred to as a Holy Hour (but can be of any duration), the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent Adoration. As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. As St. John Paul II taught: "The Eucharist, in the Mass and outside of the Mass, is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, and is therefore deserving of the worship that is given to the living God, and to Him alone."

Religious orders and the clergy have participated in Eucharistic Adoration for centuries and have encouraged the laity to do the same.

Each pope since Vatican II has implored the laity to increase devotion to the Blessed Sacrament during Adoration.

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta called Eucharistic Adoration "the best time you'll spend on earth."

HOW:

Adorers are invited to pray a rosary or other devotions, meditate on Scripture or meditate on devotional books. Adorers may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus.

WHEN:

Beginning on **October 18, 2018**, SFX will be exposing the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration *every* 3rd Thursday of the month in the Church from 6:00-7:00 pm.



 - 10. Say the Hail, Holy Queen and Closing Prayers on the medal after the five decades are completed.


Prospective Families are welcome to learn MORE at Open House


Taizé Prayer



Infant Baptisms


