Pastor's Notes

My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside... Isaiah 5:1

Jesus and Isaiah present stories of a fertile, well-protected vineyard that God freely entrusts to our care, due to no effort or merit of our own. What God asks is that we tend the vineyard on behalf of the owner, so that it produces an abundant harvest for all. Our labor in this vineyard gives our lives purpose and meaning and allows us to share in the fruit of our labors. The vineyard was given to us fully established and ready to produce a good harvest; we labor in gratitude for what has been placed in our care.

Yet too often we move away from a sense of gratitude for what we have received; we view the vineyard's harvest as something we deserve rather than something entrusted to us. In our worst moments, we refuse to share what has been so freely given. We consider ourselves the owners rather than the caretakers; we become selfish in sharing what we have come to view as "ours" and to be spent as we deem practical and in our self-interest.

The heart of the attitude of stewardship is a confession that all is gift from a loving God to be used to do God's work. Stewardship is the time I set aside each day to call to mind and thank God for the blessings in my life. Stewardship is the talent I share to help a struggling classmate or coworker. Stewardship is the treasure I give away to feed a hungry family or dig a well in Africa. Stewardship is giving over to God a share of God's bountiful harvest. And, as St. Paul reminds us, in doing what we have learned and received and heard and seen, the God of peace dwells with us. And God's peace is the greatest gift of all.

October invites us, in specific ways, to reflect on our responsibility as good stewards to care for the earth and all of creation; to protect human life from conception to natural death; to work to end domestic violence and racism in all its forms; to defend the human dignity of the immigrant, the homeless, and the prisoner. May we grow in awareness, understanding, and commitment to our responsibility as stewards.

We celebrate the good news that St. Francis Xavier Elementary School has received the National Blue Ribbon Award for the second time in our history and has been named an Exemplary High Performing National Blue Ribbon School. Thank you to our school faculty and staff, our school parent community, and our parish community for your dedication to providing the option of a Catholic elementary education for our children.


WELCOME, DEACON PHIL AND FAMILY

Prevent the flu: Get vaccinated every year

With COVID-19 also affecting our community, the flu vaccine is more important this year than ever. Influenza, commonly called "the flu," is a viral infection of the respiratory tract that may cause symptoms very similar to those of COVID-19.

Everyone six months of age and older should get a flu vaccine every season.

Flu vaccine is provided at many local health departments, private health care providers and pharmacies across Illinois. Contact your health care provider to find out which flu vaccine is right for you or you can

find vaccine locations at vaccinefinder.org.

Most people who get the flu recover completely in one to two weeks, but some people develop **serious** and **potentially life-threatening medical complications**, such as pneumonia.

Over the past decade, influenza and pneumonia have been linked to an average of **3,500 deaths** a year in Illinois.

Between **10 and 20 percent of Americans** are infected during most flu seasons, which typically run from October through May.

More than 200,000 people are hospitalized by the flu each year in the U.S.

Symptoms of flu include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Extreme tiredness
- · Dry cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle aches
- Stomach symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea also can occur but are more common in children than adults.

Emergency Warning Signs

Seek emergency medical care if you or someone you know is having any of the following warning signs below.

In children, emergency warning signs that need urgent medical attention include:

- Fast breathing or trouble breathing
- Bluish skin color
- Not drinking enough fluids
- Not waking up or not interacting
- Being so irritable that the child does not want to be held
- Fever with a rash

In adults, emergency warning signs that need urgent medical attention include:

- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen
- Sudden dizziness
- Confusion
- Severe or persistent vomiting

Seek emergency medical care if you or someone you know is experiencing any of the signs above.



Recognizing Anxiety in Men - In some men, anxiety can manifest in less recognized ways. Anxiety disorders are one of the most common mental health issues, estimated to affect close to 20% of Americans in a given year. But not everyone is affected equally — research consistently shows the number of women diagnosed with anxiety disorders is about double that of men. Researchers have yet to definitively determine the causes of this discrepancy, but anecdotal evidence and clinical experience suggests that some men respond to anxiety in ways that can cause it to be misinterpreted or else missed entirely.
