

Pastor's Notes

"I prayed, and prudence was given me."
Wisdom 7:7

The author of the Book of Wisdom praises the gift of prudence, good judgment, above all else. He praises neither riches nor power nor social status, but rather the ability to discern how such things are best to be used in God's service and the pursuit of a holy life. Such is the poverty of the young man in today's gospel. He knows the great commandments of a holy life and has lived by them all; but he seeks more. Mark tells us that Jesus looked on him, with love, and tells him that he is but lacking in one thing. He asks him to be prudent in relation to the things in his life. If his true desire is to become a disciple, he must sell all his possessions, which apparently have become a preoccupation in his life, and then give the money to the poor.

Some hear this gospel and ask, "What's wrong with being wealthy?" Nothing! The heart of the story is that, for this young man, his possessions are clouding his judgment and keeping him from pursuing the call he hears in his heart. Nonetheless, Jesus, we are told, looks at him with love before asking what he knows will, at first, seem impossible to the young man. Only the grace of prudence will allow him, in time, to let go of what holds him back to as to embrace what calls him forward.

Last weekend was an active one for our parish elementary school community. The entire student body gathered for the first time in one place for an outdoor Homecoming Pep Rally. The youngest of our students returned that evening for the return of the Ice Cream Social, also an outdoor event this year. A track meet, the Homecoming Parade and tailgate party, and two football games filled out the weekend. The parish School of Religious Education launched a new year with grade level sessions provided

by catechists in an asynchronous, virtual format. During our gradual move beyond a world shaped by COVID, this year's program will offer opportunities for parents to be more involved in their children's religious formation. This includes a request for each family to attend weekly Mass in person or to watch the livestream on Sunday or during the week, and then to discuss what they learned and experienced.

Last Sunday also was the annual Christifideles Ceremony at Holy Name Cathedral, honoring women and men from across the Archdiocese for their servant leadership in their home parish. Those who receive the award have been nominated by their Parish Council or other parish leadership. Our Parish Pastoral Council created a large list of candidates and finally chose Elizabeth Cooley as the St. Francis Xavier recipient for 2021. If you do not know Elizabeth personally, you probably have seen her at the doors of church as she worked with another parishioner to coordinate the greeters who made it possible to provide Masses, Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals within the COVID protocols. But well before this, Elizabeth has been an advocate for youth, including leading Quest groups for high school teens during all of the years her own children have been in high school. She has been active in a variety of parish ministries, and ready to invest her time and talent to serve others and our shared parish mission. Thank you and congratulations, Elizabeth!

May we all pray for the prudence to use well what God has given us.

Weekend Mass Updates at St. Francis Xavier!

The CDC has revised its recommendations on wearing masks in indoor, public spaces, following evidence that the COVID delta strain can spread rapidly even among fully vaccinated individuals. The parish Leadership Reopening Team has determined how we will respond to provide the safest possible environment for all who worship at St. Francis Xavier.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are now in effect.

- ◆ **Masks are required for everyone** over age 2, regardless of vaccination status.
- ◆ **We invite everyone to sing with your mask in place!** Pick up a bulletin as you enter church for the words to the hymns. As you leave, place any bulletins you are not taking home in the recycle baskets at each door.
- ◆ Please wait for an usher to invite your pew to come forward for communion. With your mask in place, receive the host in your hand and move six feet to the side before removing your mask to consume the host.

The following protocols remain unchanged.

- ◆ **All church doors remain open** for all worshippers.
- ◆ **Unity Hall remains open to families with small children** to offer a remote viewing option on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM and 11AM. This is only for families with small children and no cold symptoms.
- ◆ Every other pew in the back of church and in the east transept is not available for seating. These areas provide social distance for parents with infants, those with immune issues, and those not yet comfortable being closer than six feet. All other pews are available for general seating.
- ◆ Please avoid physical contact with those not of your own household, especially during the **Sign of Peace**. A nod or a wave is always appropriate.




