Pastor's Notes

The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. Matthew 22:10

Over many years, my best friend and his wife have hosted huge dinner parties at all of the major holidays. They reach beyond family to those who otherwise might have no one with whom to share a family meal. Their dining room is packed so that a second table sometimes must be set in the living room. There is an abundance of food, good conversation, and often getting to know someone who is there for the first time.

Jesus challenges his followers, *us included*, to be the servants in his parable of the banquet feast. It is not enough to fill the table with those with whom we are familiar. We are sent out to invite those we do not know and who may not feel welcome among us – *the good and the bad alike*. God's banquet hall will continue to make room until all who respond to the invitation have arrived.

This month we reflect on our responsibility to be good stewards of God's gift of life. This weekend we focus on the beginnings of human life. Sadly, conversations about the beginning of life and the protection of the unborn have become shouting matches that disrespect the dignity of those holding opposing views rather than difficult conversations about how best to care for the unborn and for those who encounter painful challenges when confronted with a pregnancy. Too often I have listened to the story of a woman whose choices were limited at an earlier time in her life due to a lack of support from family, friends, and even her faith community. They saw the accusatory looks given even at church to an unmarried woman who was obviously pregnant. They heard the behind the back gossip and whispers of some and did not think they could endure the same.

Are we a community that supports not only the unborn child, but the woman who faces a difficult pregnancy? Do we support efforts of The Women's Center and others who provide material and emotional support so that women can feel that they have a choice? Do we support and encourage those who bring a child into their home through adoption or foster care so that parents will witness healthy options for a child they know they cannot raise themselves? And do we offer a healing and welcoming home to women who made difficult choices in the past that have led them to reconsider those decisions later in life?

From the moment at which we became a person in the womb, we were offered a place at God's ever-expanding banquet table. Nothing we do in this life will cause that invitation to be withdrawn. It is only our refusal to accept that invitation that could cause us to remain outside the banquet hall. Our mission is to go out to the streets and echo God's invitation, especially to those who may feel unwelcome for whatever reason. God will not be satisfied until all have heard the invitation to feast in God's love.

In today's bulletin is a report from our parish Finance Council that provides an overview of the Annual Report that will be released next month and a picture of where we stand financially at the end of the first quarter of the current fiscal year. Thank you for your continued support of the parish mission and ministry. Each of us has a role in making possible what we do for one another and for the larger community that we serve. Thank you to our Knights of Columbus for collecting a truckload of winter wear for those in need, and to the school parents who provided our virtual Oktoberfest last weekend.

Prevent the flu: Get vaccinated every year

With COVID-19 also affecting our community, the flu vaccine is more important this year than ever. Influenza, commonly called "the flu," is a viral infection of the respiratory tract that may cause symptoms very similar to those of COVID-19.

Everyone six months of age and older should get a flu vaccine every season.

Flu vaccine is provided at many local health departments, private health care providers and pharmacies across Illinois. Contact your health care provider to find out which flu vaccine is right for you or you can

find vaccine locations at **vaccinefinder.org**.

Most people who get the flu recover completely in one to two weeks, but some people develop serious and potentially life-threatening medical complications, such as pneumonia.

Over the past decade, influenza and pneumonia have been linked to an average of **3,500 deaths** a year in Illinois.

Between 10 and 20 percent of Americans are infected during most flu seasons, which typically run from October through May.

More than **200,000 people** are hospitalized by the flu each year in the U.S.

Symptoms of flu include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Extreme tiredness
- Dry cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle aches
- Stomach symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea also can occur but are more common in children than adults.

Emergency Warning Signs

Seek emergency medical care if you or someone you know is having any of the following warning signs below.

In children, emergency warning signs that In adults, emergency warning signs that need urgent medical attention include:

- Fast breathing or trouble breathing
- Bluish skin color
- Not drinking enough fluids
- Not waking up or not interacting
- Being so irritable that the child does not want to be held
- Fever with a rash

- need urgent medical attention include:
- · Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen
- Sudden dizziness
- Confusion
- · Severe or persistent vomiting

Seek emergency medical care if you or someone you know is experiencing any of the signs above.

Your Parish Finance Report

Thanks for your patience while we finalized our budget for this fiscal year! Here's where we stand:

For Last Fiscal Year (ended June 30, 2020):

Total Collections were \$1,755,675, a decrease of about \$86,500 (4.7%) from the previous fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. Most of this occurred between March 14 and June 30 when the church building was closed due to the pandemic. Despite the decline, our parish recorded an <u>operating surplus</u> of \$36,141. Fr. Bill emailed parishioners in September with <u>a financial overview</u>. Our more detailed annual report will come out in mid-November.

For the Current Fiscal Year (ending June 30, 2021):

Our budget has been approved. The annual collections budget has been set at \$1,643,000 (about 6.5% decrease from last year's actual collections). Typically, we set our collections budget to break even with expenses. However, with the restrictions in church attendance, we do not expect our collections to be at normal levels. The Payroll Protection Loan covered parish and school payroll from April until June, enabling us to conserve the offertory received during that time and forego the school auction fundraiser. After conferring with the Finance Council, we will use our strong cash position to cover an anticipated budgeted operating deficit of \$148,000.

In preparing this year's budget, we have looked very closely at expenses and have managed them as tightly as possible without impacting our ability to fund vital ministries in our parish at this time. Many are looking to the parish for emotional, financial, and spiritual support during the pandemic. We will strive to maintain and improve our ministries, both within and outside our community. Of course, a budget deficit of this size is not sustainable in the long run; eventually, our offertory will need to return to levels above \$1.8 million to maintain the level of services that SFX parishioners have come to expect.





First quarter results (ending September 30, 2020):

Note: This budget target of \$1,643,000 assumes an operating deficit of \$148,000 by the end of the fiscal year, which will be covered by operating savings.
