Pastor's Notes

Realizing he had been healed, one of them returned and fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him.

Luke 17:15-16

Several years ago, I received a coffee mug as a birthday present. On the inside lip of the cup are the words "I am grateful for...". With each sip, it reminds me to pause and be aware of the blessings in my life on that morning, at that moment in time. I must admit that sometimes my mind is too preoccupied to notice the words. When I do pause, I see the graces in my life for which I am grateful. Gratitude is then a natural response. When I pause to realize that all the blessings in my life come to me as gifts from a loving God, I cannot but be grateful.

Gratitude is a natural response to a life of stewardship. In today's gospel, only one of the ten persons cured of leprosy seems aware that their healing is a gift from God. The other nine seem to head to the priest to be declared clean and then get busy about the lives that leprosy had forced them to abandon. They become so caught up in "doing" that they fail to appreciate what God has done for them. They miss an opportunity for the grace we receive when we pause to give thanks to God.

This month we focus on the virtue of stewardship: What does it mean to be good stewards of our lives? Do I appreciate that my life and everything in it are gifts from God, both for my enjoyment and for my part of serving God's kingdom among us? Do I live with a sense of enough time, enough talents and abilities, enough material treasure to do all that God asks of me? Do I live with a sense of abundance and gratitude?

If the above questions present challenges to my way of thinking or manner of living, how can I move toward a deeper life of stewardship? In my own life, I realize the need to pause and to be still so that God can have a voice in that fearful and sometimes frantic conversation within my head. I need to review my priorities based on what is, in fact, receiving most of my time; what talents are being ignored or misused; what part of my treasure is given to the service of God's work before I set aside money for my own desires. To paraphrase scripture, "Where my time, talent, and treasure are, there my heart will be." How might God be inviting me to seek out other neighborhoods so that my heart more fully rests in God.

Come for Eucharistic Adoration October 17 at 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT: As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. "Jesus remains in the Blessed Sacrament to give us the privilege of approaching him personally as so many people were able to do two-thousand years ago in Galilee and Judea." (Fr. F. Racine). During Eucharistic Adoration, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent adoration.

HOW: Adorers are invited to meditate on Scripture or read devotional books, pray the rosary or another devotion. You may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus. If you are interested, prayer, and reflection suggestions are available as starting points.

WHO: Jesus waits for us, each one of us, in the Eucharist. He waits when you are joyful, thankful, frustrated, or tired. All are welcome, including children. He specifically calls children to Himself, "Let the children come to me."

WHY: Since Apostolic times, Catholics rightly have gathered to celebrate Mass in community as Jesus instructed. Adoration provides an opportunity for an intimate relationship with Jesus through individual worship, prayer, and listening. Adoration is the "face-to-face that leads to the "heart-to-heart" with Jesus.

Domestic Violence Outreach St. Francis Xavier, St. Cletus and St. John of the Cross



Here's what I don't want people to know about me.

"I am an abuser. I am male, female, gay, straight, educated or not, wealthy, poor, or in the middle. I represent every ethnic and racial group possible. I may or may not have been abused as a child or adult myself. I do not necessarily dabble in alcohol or other drugs, but I may. I am a Christian, Muslim, and a Jew from any and all religious persuasions. I don't like myself very much, but I don't seem to be able to stop what I am doing. I may be more abusive when I am angry, and I seem to react strongly when I think a situation is getting out of my control. Sometimes my violence is physical, but not always. I also abuse people verbally, psychologically, and sexually. Sometimes I am so subtle, people don't even know it's happened until much later when they feel bad."

MYTH: Most of the time, domestic violence is not really that serious.

<u>FACT:</u> Domestic violence is an illegal act in the U.S. and is considered a crime with serious repercussions. Although there are aspects of domestic violence (e.g. emotional, psychological, spiritual, financial abuse) that may not be considered criminal in a legal sense, serious and long-lasting physical, emotional and spiritual harms can, and often do, occur. Each and every act of domestic violence needs to be taken seriously.







An Invitation to Spiritual Direction

What is it? Spiritual Direction is a way of appreciating and responding to your life's journey in the light of the Lord's life and love. As you grow physically, spiritually and emotionally, it is often helpful to talk with someone about how to integrate all of these experiences into a life of faith. A spiritual director is someone with experience and training who can be a companion or friend willing to listen and talk about your journey in all its joys and concerns.

Who goes? Perhaps you are experiencing a real spiritual hunger and want to explore ways of filling it. You may be asking yourself: "How is God real for me now?" or, "How is my faith meaningful for me in this situation? These are areas that suggest a spiritual companion (director) would be helpful. Other areas that might be the focus of conversation with a spiritual director (companion) include: questions about religion; the need for expanding your image of God; successes or failures in trying to live a more loving life; bringing the Lord into important decisions in your life; exploring moral dilemmas.

What happens? You enter into a conversation and trusting relationship in which the director (companion) helps you notice and respond to the movement of God as experienced in prayer and in the events of everyday life. The director acts primarily as a listener, as a supportive person who can help you look honestly at your relationship with God as it is lived out in everyday life. You are always the gatekeeper in terms of what you bring to spiritual direction and how much of yourself you share and reveal. Spiritual direction is not a therapy session, but a prayerful conversation designed to help you become more award of God's voice and to help you discover the best ways to respond to that voice.

How to begin? If you would like to respond to this invitation, you may call Mary Agnes Dwyer at 773-441-8151 so you can make an appointment. Your appointments can be scheduled at convenient intervals, monthly or every two or three weeks, whatever suites your needs at this time. Your meeting would be in a room in the rectory. Mary Agnes has training in spiritual direction and also has a Master of Theology Degree from the Catholic Theological Union. There is no fee.

As you begin spiritual direction or as some refer to this process, spiritual companioning, you may want to reflect on your own growth in prayer, where God fits into your joys and concerns of your life at this time, or whatever it is that you feel could help your relationship with God grow. "It is in God that we live, and move, and have our being."






