

Pastor's Notes

"Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant." Mark 10:43

James and John take Jesus aside and ask to have the first places when Jesus comes into his glory. In doing so, they arouse the jealousy of the other disciples. Their shared insensitivity to what Jesus has just shared is clear. On three occasions, Jesus has spoken to them of his approaching passion and death on a cross. He has taught that the disciple is one who places serving others above all else. Yet, his chosen Twelve are focused only on his promise of glory with him in heaven. They will not consider, let alone travel, the path that leads to glory through sacrifice.

Jesus again places *service of others before all else*. The path to glory in God's kingdom is accompanied by a lifetime of opportunities to share what I have been given with those in greater need. The small, daily sacrifices may go unnoticed by others, even those closest to us. We may receive little or no recognition, praise, or honors for our efforts. Nonetheless, as we give ourselves to others in love, we grow richer in the treasures of heaven, which can never be taken from us.

This weekend, we "see" several parish ministries that continue throughout the year. unnoticed by the rest of us. At the Saturday evening Mass, we bless the prayer shawls that parishioners have knitted while praying for whoever might eventually receive them. These shawls are a tangible way to share the prayers of our community with those who are living with illness, separation, grief, depression, or other situations. After each Mass, members of our Prayer Shawl Ministry will be in God's Garage, which is located between the rectory and school buildings. If you know of someone with whom you would like to share a shawl, please stop by. Also in God's Garage, members of our Respect Life Ministry are distributing envelopes for the annual "baby bottle collection" to support the work of the Women's Center of La Grange. This critical ministry provides options to women encountering pregnancy in difficult circumstances, including material, emotional, and spiritual support. It is one practical way to support the unborn and their parents during Respect Life month.

Finally, our **Knights of Columbus** chapter begins the annual **Winter Clothing Drive** for those who lack sufficient warm clothing for the coming winter. Set aside some time to go through your winter items (coats, sweaters, scarves, etc.) and identify any items in good condition that are more than your household needs or will use. Collection boxes will be located at the church doors for the next few weekends. The items must be dropped off on or before Sunday afternoon, November 7.

Weekend Mass Updates at St. Francis Xavier!

The CDC has revised its recommendations on wearing masks in indoor, public spaces, following evidence that the COVID delta strain can spread rapidly even among fully vaccinated individuals. The parish Leadership Reopening Team has determined how we will respond to provide the safest possible environment for all who worship at St. Francis Xavier.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are **now in effect**.

- Masks are <u>required for everyone</u> over age 2, regardless of vaccination status.
- We invite everyone to sing with your mask in place! Pick up a bulletin as you enter church for the words to the hymns. As you leave, place any bulletins you are not taking home in the recycle baskets at each door.
- Please wait for an usher to invite your pew to come forward for communion. <u>With your</u> <u>mask in place</u>, receive the host in your hand and move six feet to the side before removing your mask to consume the host.

The following protocols remain unchanged.

- <u>All</u> church doors remain open for all worshippers.
- Unity Hall remains open to families with small children to offer a remote viewing option on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM and 11AM. This is <u>only</u> for families with small children and no cold symptoms.
- Every other pew in the back of church and in the east transept is <u>not</u> available for seating. These areas provide social distance for parents with infants, those with immune issues, and those not yet comfortable being closer than six feet. All other pews are available for general seating.
- Please avoid physical contact with those not of your own household, especially during the Sign of Peace. A nod or a wave is always appropriate.
