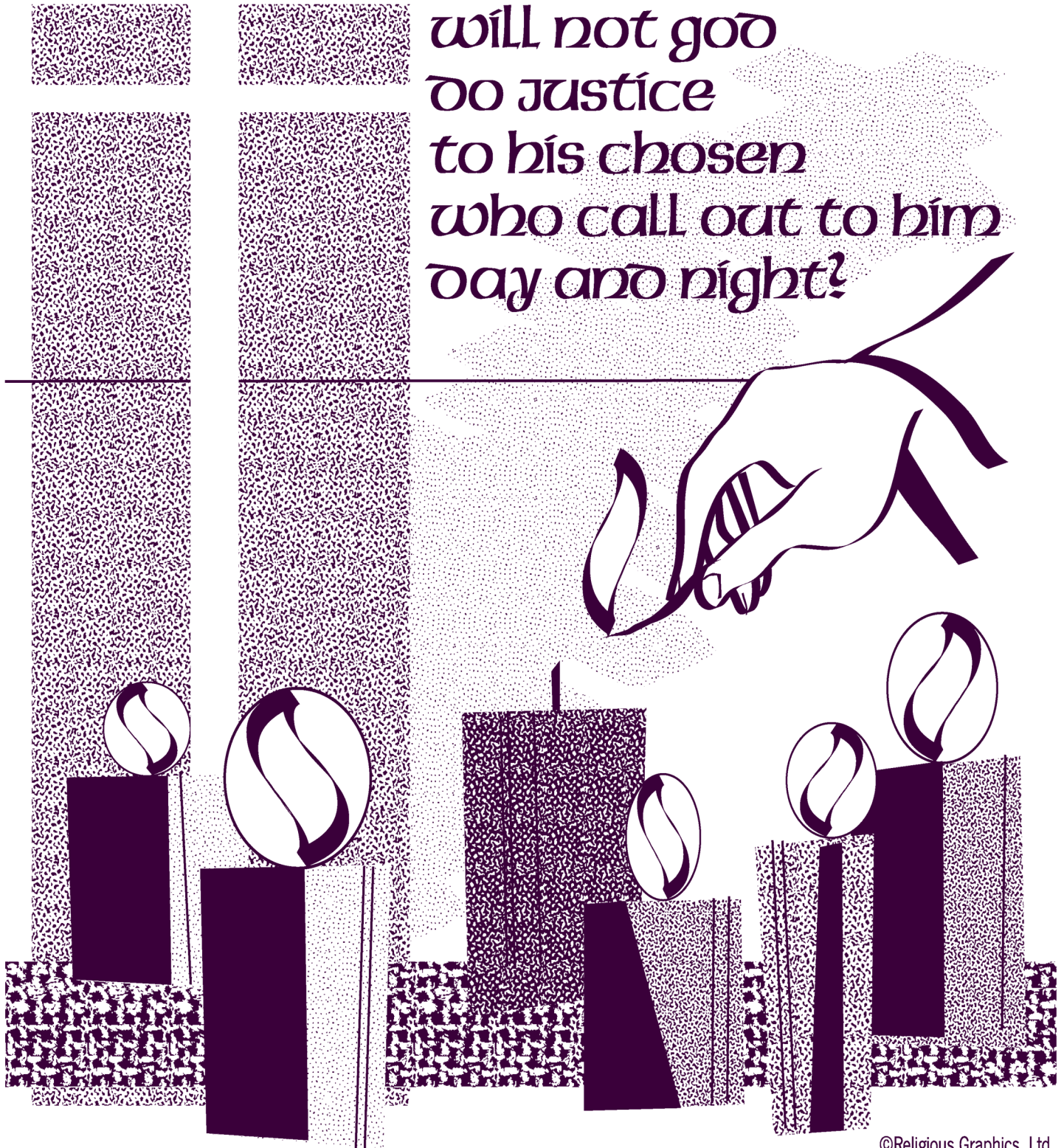

Pastor's Notes

As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace.
1 Peter 4:10

This year the children in our parish elementary school are focusing on “superpowers.” These superpowers are not the ability to fly, shoot webs, or transform themselves into another being. Rather, they are focusing on the superpowers that are their God-given talents and abilities that become the ways in which they love and serve God in their relationships with others. What are your “superpowers”?

Stewardship of time and talent is the focus on our second Sunday of reviewing the stewardship of our lives as individuals and as a faith community. Parish youths and young adults offer their reflections this weekend on how they are living a life of stewardship and how this affects their lives as disciples of Jesus. Our children and youth remind us that stewardship is a virtue we can practice from early in life until the end of our lives on earth. As St. Peter says, each of us has received gifts for the common good. It is the communion of our varied gifts that makes Christ that much more present and active among us and in our presence and action beyond the walls of our church building. Good stewardship is nothing more than choosing to share our time, talent, and treasure as God directs us.

In two weeks, we will emphasize some of the parish ministries that are especially in need of new volunteers. You will be asked to reflect on whether God is inviting you to share some of your time and talent through one of these ministries. Some of you are called to share your time and talent within the family or with the larger community. God bless you. Some of you may have the mistaken notion that you must be a certain “type” of person to participate in a parish ministry. Obviously certain ministries require certain talents (It would require more than a little practice before I could participate in the knitting of Prayer Shawls). Most ministries ask only a willingness to give some of your time and talent in a spirit of kindness and collaboration.

I am appealing today to anyone who is hearing a call to serve as a member of the **reformatted Parish Pastoral Council**. In the renewed format, *we are seeking a diverse group of parishioners who offer a variety of perspectives* and who together represent the “voice” of this faith community. So, *there is no one “type” of person* that we seek for the reformatted PPC. This is a two-year commitment. I live in your neighborhood.

"I am a woman with three children. I have an MBA, a good job, and I live in a nice Chicago suburb. However, I have had several visits to the Emergency Room this past year. I try to go to different ERs so they won't recognize me coming in. I have to pay out of pocket since my insurance doesn't cover all these out-of-network visits. I don't come in right away. I wait until the bleeding has stopped, until I am calmer, until I can think up a plausible story to go with my cuts and bruises. I think that my husband is jealous of my education and earning ability. He never finished college. He earns less than I do. Still, I do not withhold money. We put everything into a joint account. I love him and I don't hold it over him. But it seems like every month when we pay bills, he starts feeling like he's one down. He starts belittling me first, I guess to make himself feel better, and soon he gets physical. He has never hurt me too bad. I've had a few stitches, but no broken bones like some women. He always feels so sad when it's all over. I know he doesn't want to hurt me. Something just happens....."

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: October 19; November 16; January 25; February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: October 19; November 9; February 1 & 8; April 18.
