Pastor's Letter

"O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Luke 18:13

"Would you like to pray an act of contrition now or later?" This sometimes becomes a moment of hesitation when celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation, especially if some time has passed since the person last celebrated the Sacrament. I sometimes wonder whether forgetting "the words" and formulas causes some to stay away from the individual celebration of the Sacrament. I remind a hesitant penitent that an "act of contrition" need not be those of the prayer we learned as a child. In fact, if you are of my generation, the words of that Act of Contrition have changed at least twice in my lifetime ("because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell", "because of Thy just punishments", "because I have offended You, my God"). The most basic expression of contrition is voiced by the tax collector in today's gospel: "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." I acknowledge that I have been unfaithful to God's commands of love and humbly ask God's loving mercy.

There was a time not so long ago when it was considered a shameful thing to acknowledge that one was a sinner. For many, the shame was deepened by the "dark box" in which we knelt to confess our sins, hearing the words of forgiveness from a voice on the other side of a screen, too shameful to look eye to eye into the face of the priest. It can be difficult to admit my sins to another human being, especially to one who has been given the authority to speak in God's name. Yet Jesus emphasizes, time and again, that admitting that I have sinned is the first step on the path of healing and wholeness. Hiding from our sins is like placing a band aid over a serious wound and refusing to seek treatment, risking a more serious infection. And while the priest who is hearing my sins has been given the authority to speak in God's name, he himself is a sinner with his own need to confess to another priest if he is to know healing in his own life.

"O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." And Jesus says, "I tell you, this man went home justified, for whoever humbles themselves will be exalted." This is the message of Jesus. This gospel challenges us to reconsider: Do I believe that God forgives my sins, no matter what? Do I believe that God's desire is to release me from the shame that causes me to hide, so that I can witness to God's loving mercy? And is this the message and witness I offer to children, young people, and those who are afraid to approach God?

As you read this, I am in the middle of my annual eight-day silent retreat near the foothills of the Rocky Mountains. I have brought you all with me in prayer as I seek to open my heart to God's direction for my life. The opportunity to be with the Lord in silence is a great blessing, and I am grateful for this opportunity. If you find yourself up before the sunrise, know that one hour earlier I was sitting at the top of a hill and being with God in the sacred beauty of the colors and wonder of dawn.
