Pastor's Notes

I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count. from every nation, race, people, and tongue. Revelation 7:9

The election season is about to end. Over the next few days, our votes will have been cast and counted and winners declared in the many races for public office. Many of us will breathe a deep sigh of relief that the volume of the barrage of accusations and misrepresentations and arguments that have disturbed and even divided families will begin to decrease. We pray for graciousness and civility among winners and losers and their supporters. We pray for peace: in our homes, our families, our communities, and our nation.

We move toward Election Day with two liturgical celebrations that seek to draw our hearts and minds to the broader vision in which we live the shifting details of our lives on earth. This weekend we celebrate the women, men, youth, and children who have been proclaimed by the Church as models of holiness for us all. They were kings and servants, rich and poor, married and celibate, and of all lands and all ages. Some became saints through the nature of their deaths, others through their acts of daily living. None were perfect, and some were thought insane in their time. All came to see a vision of something so much greater than themselves and devoted their lives to helping others to embrace the vision of a loving God who came to save us and whose Spirit dwells among us.

Monday, we remember the saints in our personal lives. They are people of all ages and walks of life. They touched our lives with their loving kindness or inspired us with their faith or taught us by word or example. If their departure from this earth was more recent, we may shed a tear for the loss of their physical presence. A plaque throughout this month includes the names of those whom we have lost during this past year. There may be elements of our relationship with them that we still are working through; there may be things we have not yet said or blessings of their lives that we have just begun to realize. We remember them and profess our belief that we remain one with them and hope that one day we will be with them forever.

If my reflections this week seem out of sync with events of the past two weeks, it is because bulletin deadlines required me to write these words before I left for retreat on October 18. Whatever the details of the events of recent weeks, the vision set forth in Revelation and our belief in God's presence and action in something much larger than the present moment remain.

In recent weeks, our parish staff and leadership have been discussing plans for our 2020 Christmas Schedule. We cannot know how the coronavirus might affect how we will celebrate the birth of Christ this year. We can presume that we will not be able to celebrate in the same way as we have in past years and plan to do in future years. We plan to celebrate Masses on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, and to livestream three of those Masses, each with a distinct flavor. We will gather people on our campus as much as possible within the COVID protocols at that time and based upon the availability of volunteers to provide necessary support. Stay tuned as our plans take shape.

QUEST!

Dear Quest teens, parents, and leaders,

Come, Holy Spirit! We are so grateful for your patience as we navigate Quest logistics amidst COVID-19. We have been thinking long and hard about how to make Quest the most **life-giving** and **Spirit-inspired** program it can be for our teens as they prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation – an amazing sacrament that truly has the power to **transform our lives and the world** when we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit sincerely.

We are pleased to announce that **Quest will begin in November** — in-person and virtually according to teen and parent comfort levels. For in-person meetings to occur, Quest groups must have unanimous consensus on meeting in-person (amongst both the teens and the parents.) Each teen and parent will also sign an agreement not to attend in-person if they are ill. Groups of about 10 teens will meet **once a month** and will **set their own meeting dates/times**. All families who have registered for Quest will receive a survey to ensure that the groups formed share similar expectations and comfort levels regarding in-person or virtual meetings.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Will we have to keep the windows open during the winter to provide clean air?

No. This past summer, the parish installed four air sterilizers into the main air supply of the church. The units are commercial ionic photo-oxidation air purifiers. The air is sterilized/sanitized/purified as it passes through the main duct and through the grates in the nave of the church. We were able to obtain these units through a generous contribution from a parishioner who is an HVAC professional.

During the summer, the air conditioned air followed this path and has sanitized the air in church through most of the summer and autumn. The air in the church has constantly been cleaned and/or replaced by a combination of using the air sterilizers and partially opening the windows during the day. This winter, in addition to heating the church through convection from the radiators behind the grates, we also will activate the air handling system so that the heated air continues to be sanitized. Whenever weather permits, we also will continue to introduce fresh air into the church by slightly opening windows, especially when the church is not occupied. Are air purifiers with ionizers safe? Ionic air purifiers (ionizers) clean the air by emitting negative ions, which are harmless to humans. This is different from ozone generators, which can emit high levels of ozone that may have negative health effects.

Our Facilities Team continues to do everything possible to make returning to church comfortable and safe for those who choose to attend services.

From Your SFX Parish Counselor

There's a fine line between stress and anxiety. Both are emotional responses, but stress is typically caused by an external trigger. The trigger can be short-term, such as a work deadline or a fight with a loved one or long-term, such as poverty, discrimination and chronic illness. People under stress experience mental and physical symptoms, such as irritability, anger, fatigue, muscle pain, digestive troubles and difficulty sleeping.

Anxiety, on the other hand, is defined by persistent, excessive worries that don't go away even in the absence of a stressor. Anxiety leads to a nearly identical set of symptoms as stress: insomnia, difficulty concentrating, fatigue, muscle tension and irritability.

Both mild stress and mild anxiety respond well to similar coping mechanisms. Physical activity, a nutritious and varied diet, and good sleep hygiene are a good starting point, but there are other coping mechanisms available.

Peace and Justice

Study Guide: Pope Francis' Fratelli Tutti

On October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis released a new encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti: On Fraternity and Social Friendship*. This social encyclical explores building a culture of peace and dialogue in order to work together to care for each other as a human family, especially as we recover from the pandemic.



The Maryknoll Office for Global Concerns has created a <u>6-page study guide for Fratelli Tutti</u>. In this study guide, we offer key <u>points</u> and <u>quotes</u> from each chapter of *Fratelli Tutti*, along with reflection questions and the two prayers that Pope Francis includes at the end of the encyclical.

Over eight chapters and 92 pages, the Holy Father offers a remedy against self-destruction and despair, which includes an openness to love, charity, and kindness, and a rejection of war, nuclear weapons and the death penalty. Like *Laudato Si'*, *Fratelli Tutti* is a social encyclical, where the pope applies the moral teachings of the Church to the social and economic challenges of the current day. Also like *Laudato Si'*, this encyclical is inspired by the life of St. Francis of Assisi, who responded to the Church and the world in his time time, and is structured using the three-part See-Judge-Act method.

We hope this guide enables individuals and small groups to learn Pope Francis' teachings and use them to build peace and solidarity in your relationships, community, and world.

What is the Pumpkin Smash?

The Pumpkin Smash is an annual effort by communities to divert pumpkins from landfills by providing locations for residents to drop-off jack-olanterns to be composted. It is held each year the Saturday after Halloween. Don't Trash it, Smash it!

SCARCE and the cities of Wheaton and Elmhurst hosted the first pumpkin collections in 2014, diverting 9.31 tons of pumpkins from landfills and helping to improve composting laws in Illinois.

By 2016 the Pumpkin Smash grew to over 31 sites across the state.

The Pumpkin Smash has diverted over 377 tons of pumpkins from landfills.

Why Keep Pumpkins Out of the Landfill?

Composting is nature's way of recycling with many benefits:

- Avoids landfill greenhouse gas emissions from decomposing organics (currently, landfills are the 3rd largest producers of methane in the U.S.!)
- Produces a useful, nutrient-dense soil amendment
- Pumpkins are 90% water which is great for our soil, not so good in our landfills.
