

Pastor's Notes

"The greatest among you will be your servant."

Matthew 23:11

Jesus has responded to a series of challenges from the religious authorities in Jerusalem, who soon will condemn him to death. He now speaks to his disciples and the crowd, and cautions them not to follow the example of those who focus on an outward *appearance* of holiness rather than an inward attitude of service. The servant leader is one who humbly *serves others*, without seeking attention or reward.

St. Francis Xavier is blessed by hundreds of servant leaders. You soon will receive the Parish Annual Report, which offers a glimpse of the contributions of time, talent, and treasure that bring vibrancy to our mission. Parish men, women, and youth, often unknown to the rest of us, provide shelter for the homeless and food for the hungry; they bring communion to the sick and homebound; they knit prayer shawls; they volunteer their time and talent to the religious formation of children, youth, and adults. **You bless us by your generous service!**

Two weeks ago, the consultants guiding us in developing a strategic plan for our parish school gathered feedback from over 200 parish parents, other parishioners, teachers, and parish boards and councils. With your help, we are developing a plan that will enable our parish school to better serve all our families and the larger community. **You bless us by your willingness to share** your time and perspectives.

Last Sunday, choir members and other parishioners filled the space at Grace Lutheran Church in a shared

commemoration of the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's call for church reform. Several parish youth helped with hospitality after the 9:30 service. **You blessed us by coming together** to celebrate what we have in common.

This Sunday afternoon, Dr. Kate DeVries officially becomes a Pastoral Associate of the Archdiocese of Chicago in a ceremony for all those being commissioned in the Archdiocese. I encourage you to find a moment to congratulate Kate for her willingness to serve the larger Church and the people of St. Francis Xavier Parish. **You bless us through your service** to the Church. This weekend we also officially welcome those from our parish in the process of joining our faith community as fully initiated Catholics; and we invite our youth preparing for Confirmation to commit themselves to this year of practicing what we believe in-service, ministry, and sharing.

Finally, this Friday the men of the parish restore an SFX tradition begun by John Yelnick many years ago with a Pig Roast. And we all are encouraged to gather next Sunday at Grace Lutheran for a presentation by and with leaders of the Jewish, Muslim, and Christian faiths, concerning Jerusalem as a shared holy place. Our blessings abound!

Scripture Reflection

Jesus spoke strong words against the scribes and the Pharisees in today's gospel. He tells us they do not practice what they preach, they like to show off, they love being in places and having titles of honor, and they lay heavy burdens on others without lifting a finger to help carry the load. He has painted a clear picture of who the crowd before him then and now we are not to be.

Instead of showing off and putting ourselves above others, the followers of Jesus are to recognize that we are all brothers and sisters – beloved sons and daughters of God. What makes someone great is not power and a fancy title, but rather being humble and respectful in every situation. Instead of ordering others around and making their lives more difficult, we are called to serve one another, to help them bear the load.

A great example of how to live as a disciple of Jesus was presented by St. Paul in today's second reading. "We were gentle among you, as a nursing mother cares for her children. With such affection for you, we were determined to share with you not only the gospel of God, but our very selves as well, so dearly beloved had you become to us." (1 Thes. 2:7-8) May we live in love, humility and service, pouring out our lives to build the Kingdom of God.

Welcome and Congratulations to our RCIA Catechumens & Candidates!

At the 9:00 am Mass this weekend, we celebrate the Rite of Acceptance (for those preparing for baptism) and Welcome (for those becoming Catholic and completing their sacraments of initiation.)




Christmas Cards For Prisoners

ABOUT THE DREAM ACT OF 2017



Sens. Lindsey Graham (R-South Carolina) and Dick Durbin (D-Illinois) introduced the Dream Act of 2017, S. 1615, in the Senate on July 20, 2017. Congresswomen Ileana Ros-Lehtinen (R-Florida) and Lucille Roybal-Allard (D-California) introduced the Dream Act, H.R. 3440, in the House on July 26, 2017.

This bipartisan, bicameral bill would provide Dreamers — young undocumented immigrants who were brought to the United States as children and have lived in the U.S. at least four years — protection from deportation and an opportunity to obtain legal status and citizenship if they meet certain requirements.

What would the Dream Act Do? The Dream Act would create a conditional permanent resident status valid for up to eight years for young undocumented immigrants that would protect them from deportation, allow them to work legally in the U.S. and permit them to travel outside the country.

To qualify, young undocumented immigrants would need to meet the following requirements:

- Through documentation described in the bill, establish that they were brought to the U.S. at age 17 or younger and have lived continuously in the U.S. for at least 4 years prior to the bill's enactment;
- Pass a government background check, demonstrate “good moral character” with no felony or multiple misdemeanor convictions, submit biometric and biographic data and undergo a biometric and medical exam;
- Demonstrate they have been admitted to a college or university, have earned a high school diploma, or are in the process of earning a high school diploma or an equivalent; and pay a fee.

The bill would automatically grant conditional permanent resident status to DACA recipients who still meet the requirements needed to obtain DACA. Conditional permanent resident status can be changed to lawful permanent resident status — green card holder — by:

- Maintaining continuous residence in the U.S.;
- Meeting one of the following three requirements:
- Completion of at least two years of military service,
- Graduation from a college or university or completion of at least two years of a bachelor's or higher degree program in the U.S., or
- Employment for a period totaling at least three years;
- Demonstrating an ability to read, write and speak English and an understanding of American history, principles and form of government;
- Passing a government background check, continuing to demonstrate “good moral character” without felony or multiple misdemeanor convictions, submitting biometric and biographic data and undergoing a biometric and medical exam; and paying a fee.

Recipients can lose conditional permanent resident status if they commit a serious crime or fail to meet the other requirements set in the bill.

The Dream Act helps the American economy. Over the next 10 years, young undocumented immigrants who currently have DACA will contribute an estimated \$433.4 billion to the GDP, \$60 billion in fiscal impact, and \$12.3 billion in taxes to Social Security and Medicare.


