Pastor's Letter

Let us walk in the light of the Lord!
Isaiah 2:5

Isaiah prophesies to a people who have become *comfortable* after almost fifty years of captivity and exile in a foreign land. They are *comfortable where they are* and *comfortable as they are*. They have no desire to uproot themselves to return to a ruined former homeland. Isaiah speaks to them of the great promise that awaits them if they *choose to be uncomfortable* and turn to the Lord. They are meant to be *a light for all the nations*; but this cannot happen unless they are willing to leave where they are and begin anew.

St. Paul takes this image one step further. Disciples of Jesus must put on *the armor of light* and reflect Christ's light to others through our thoughts, words, and deeds. We cannot sit back in comfort and safety; we cannot be satisfied with things as they are. We are servants of a kingdom of justice and peace that has been planted among us but that has not yet come to full fruit. While there still are people without enough food and safe water; while the dignity of any person or group of people is discounted or attacked; while there are those who seek division rather than communion, who turn to the sword rather than the plowshare, *we have a mission that calls us out of comfort into action*.

Today we are asked to contribute to the **Catholic Campaign for Human Development**. CCHD provides resources to communities and groups that are working to lift people out of the cycle of poverty, unjust disadvantages, and deep frustration – situations that can lead to violence. CCHD offers a “hand up” rather than a “hand out”; they have had great success across our nation. I encourage you to invest in their efforts.

We begin a new liturgical year, the year of Matthew, and a new season, Advent. Cardinal Cupich has challenged us to invite and encourage one another to return to a regular practice of *participating in person* in Sunday Mass after two and a half years in which it has been impossible or risky to do. Like the Israelites to whom Isaiah prophesies, many of us may have become comfortable with “watching the Cardinal on television” or catching some of the parish livestream. Some have developed other ways to spend the Sunday hour that they once spent in communion with other parishioners. Others already may have lost the practice of Sunday Mass *before* churches closed in March 2020.

Advent invites us to begin anew as people of light who seek to know and reflect Christ's light. We bring light when we become good stewards of our talents and share some of what God has given me with others. This Friday, the children of St. Francis Xavier Elementary School will devote the day to serving others. Each grade level will go out to share their gifts in various activities with various groups of people. Next week we will distribute the Giving Tree Tags, which offer us ways to provide Christmas gifts for families in need, food for those who are hungry, and specific, material support to those who have arrived in our area legally seeking asylum from the terrors of the countries they fled.

We light the first candle of Advent. We put on the armor of light and go forth in the light of Christ.

In this time when the nights grow longer and the days grow colder, *we bring the light and warmth of Jesus, who wants to walk with us and to be known by us* not only on Christmas Day, but *in each moment that is*, including this one!


The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.




The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.
