

Pastor's Notes

"The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made...." Jeremiah 33:14

We begin the year of Luke's gospel as we ended the year of Mark. Jesus speaks of the end times as his passion and death approach. Just as his death on a Cross will be the sign of God's love and mercy transforming the world, so will the end of the world as we know it signal God's ultimate redemption of humankind and all creation. And just as the road to the Cross caused most of the disciples of Jesus to flee in fear, so the signs of the end times will cause some to die of fright. Yet we are challenged to stand erect and to trust that just as the Cross led to Christ's Resurrection from the dead, so the end of the world as we know it will bring the fulfillment of God's plan to bring all things into one in Christ.

23 days....How will we move through *this* Advent season? Advent invites us to live in the past, present, and future, *all at once*. We prepare to celebrate God's loving decision to come into the world as a tiny infant, one like us. We make a more conscious effort to open our eyes and our hearts to the coming of God into our world and our lives in the ordinary moments of *each* day. And we strive to be a people of hope and joy who look to the moment not yet revealed, when we will see God "coming in a cloud with great power and glory."

Last weekend we presented the Parish Annual Report for the fiscal year that ended June 30th. Extra copies of that bulletin can be found at all church doors and were sent electronically to all parishioners for whom we have a current email address. You can also find it on the parish website. An increased stewardship of treasure since July 1st has kept us close to our budgeted income for the current year. Much of this is due to over 100 households

that enrolled in online giving this past year. We are half-way to our current goal of enrolling 60 new households by December 31st, which would bring us to over 500 parish households who are investing electronically in the parish mission and ministries. The heart of stewardship is expressed in a note I received recently: "Though we aren't financially contributing a great deal at this time, over the years we've contributed a lot of time to church and school." **God bless you.**

Thanksgiving week demonstrated again the generous stewardship of parishioners in many forms. Our request for 120 apple and pumpkin pies for our parish Food Pantry brought in **161 pies**. The extra apple pies have been frozen to be distributed at Christmas. **Fifty volunteers** in the parish Food Pantry practiced stewardship of time and talent and distributed turkeys and trimmings for 110 households. We still are collecting Thanksgiving donations for Solidarity Bridge, a medical mission to Bolivia and Paraguay, connected to the Archdiocese, that provides equipment and training so that medical professionals in those countries can provide care that otherwise would be unavailable. **Thank you** all for your outpouring of generosity.

As we light the first candle of the Advent wreath, let us share a commitment to look for the signs of God's presence and action among us *in each moment and circumstance* of these days that lead us to Christmas.

Blessings on the Feast Day of our Patron, St. Francis Xavier, this Monday.

Today we enter the season of Advent, a time of great expectation and hope. We look forward to welcoming anew the child Jesus into our hearts. What gifts might this Holy Child bring? What gifts shall we offer him in return? How can we prepare the way, to make a home for him in our hearts this day?

The pace of life quickens around us as we move through this holy season together. For many of us, anxieties inevitably arise as we race to fulfill all those holiday customs and social obligations. For others, these Advent days are but reminders of regret, stress, or personal loss. It can be overwhelming. Try not to let it get to you. On your holiday checklist, remember to keep faith and hope at the forefront.

The lure of the material world, secularization of traditions, and global unrest can truly shake the "ground" upon which we stand. Indeed, sometimes it seems like the world as we know it is crumbling at its core. Yet we are reminded this day and throughout Advent that *all things are possible with God*. Our part is to prepare spiritually and open our hearts for the Glory of God that is to come, our Lord Jesus Christ.

This prayer can promote a kind to inner unity of person, allowing the spirit to be more open and attentive to what is essential. It is our hope that you will join us, especially at this time when our world is much in need of prayer.



Want peace and joy during the Advent Season? Come join us for Eucharistic Adoration! December 20, 2018 at 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT: During Adoration, sometimes referred to as a Holy Hour (but can be of any duration), the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent Adoration. As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. St. John Paul II offered that "our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete."

HOW: Adorers are invited to pray a rosary or other devotions, meditate on Scripture or meditate on devotional books. Adorers may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus. If you are interested, prayer and reflection suggestions are available as starting points.

WHO: Jesus waits for us, each of us, in the Eucharist. He waits when we are joyful, thankful, frustrated, or tired. All are welcome, including children. Families are most welcome. Jesus specifically calls children to Himself, "Let the children come to me." Especially during this Advent Season, children can focus on the true celebration of the season: the coming of the Infant Jesus and His continued presence. Children's activities, books, and meditations on the rosary, adoration, sacraments are available for even our youngest adorers.

WHY: As we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth, it's important to remember, He is still present with us in the Eucharist. As St. Teresa of Calcutta reminds us: The Holy Eucharist is the continuation of Christ's incarnation on earth. The mystery of the Eucharist gives us the joy of having Christmas every day. When we come to the Blessed Sacrament we come to Bethlehem, a name which means "house of bread." Jesus chose to be born in Bethlehem because He would dwell with us forever as the "Living Bread" come down from heaven. When the shepherds and Magi came to adore Him, they brought Him so much joy with their humble visit to Bethlehem that their visit has been praised and retold down through the centuries. [Y]our humble visit to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament brings Him so much joy that it will be retold for all eternity and bring the world closer to His promise of peace on earth.

WHEN: The next opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration will be **December 20, 2018.** The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from 6:00-7:00 pm. The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Thursday 9:00 am-8:30 pm, Friday 8:30 am-4:30 pm;



Saturday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am-1:00 pm.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.


Youth Ministry Christmas Party






Parish Counselor
