Pastor's Notes

Comfort, give comfort to my people. Isaiah 40:1

Comfort is especially welcome this Advent. Many of us were separated from loved ones for Thanksgiving and may face the same separation at Christmas. We all know at least one family who has lost a loved one due to the coronavirus; and we face a long winter with many more deaths before vaccines will help turn the tide. We have come through a particularly divisive election year that has stirred mistrust and bad feelings that may need some time to heal. And the societal evils of racism and the oppression of the poor stubbornly confront us in ways that both confuse and hold us bound.

Amid all this, God speaks words of comfort. God wants us to know that *God is present in this moment*, in the very heart of all we are experiencing. God does not control or manipulate human and worldly occurrences. Rather, *God's Advent*, God's coming into our midst in the *present* moment, *is the Light of Christ*, assuring us that the darkness will not overcome; that God walks in the very midst of darkness; and that God transforms the seemingly hopeless with the Light of new hope.

More importantly, *God sends us* as prophets of hope. God offers us comfort that we, in turn, might bring comfort to those most in need of hope. *We are sent* as God's loving presence to walk with those who grieve the loss of a loved one. *We are sent* as God's strength to those caring for the sick and seeking to protect us from harm. *We are sent* as God's encouragement to the isolated, the depressed, and those struggling with addiction or other mental illness. *We are sent* as God's call for justice to those without adequate food, clothing, or shelter and those who lack opportunity because of

societal inequities. We are sent as God's Advent in this moment, to give comfort to God's people.

You will find the Christmas Mass Schedule in this bulletin on page 4. We could use a few more people to join our current volunteers as greeters or to prepare the church for the next Mass. If you are high school age or older and in good health and willing to assist at a Christmas Mass, we will welcome your gift of time. On Wednesday, December 9, we will open the online reservation system for all Christmas Masses. Our limit of 20% of seating capacity allows us to reserve 110 spaces for each Mass in the church and for the two Masses in the gym; and 80 spaces for the livestreaming of two Masses into Joyce Hall, at which Communion will be distributed. Reservations are required to participate in person. We will livestream the 5:00PM Christmas Eve Mass, Midnight Mass, and the 11:00AM Christmas Day Mass so that others can participate from home. In one format or another all are welcome and encouraged to join with us to celebrate Christ's birth.

On December 3, the Church celebrated the feast day of our patron, St. Francis Xavier. This Sunday, we celebrate the feast day of St. Nicholas. These two holy persons showed a special love and care for the poor, for children, and for those in distant lands. May they inspire us to do the same. Tuesday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. We will celebrate a special evening Mass at 7:00PM in addition to the Mass at 8:30AM. Reservations can be made via the parish website or by calling the parish office.
