

#### Pastor's Notes

Welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you, for the glory of God. Romans 15:7

Isaiah presents a vision of a future in which all creation shall live in harmony; those who walk in the way of the Lord will be a light for all the nations. Wars and divisions will cease; former enemies will dwell in peace and mutual understanding. *All will be welcome*.

What does it mean to welcome all? We strive to be a community of welcome when we gather for Eucharist and through the many other ways that we cross paths in the parish and in the wider community. Food pantry volunteers do so every Tuesday when they greet and assist those who come to our doors, including over 100 families just before Thanksgiving; BEDS volunteers do so for the homeless of our community from October into May. Welcome ministers have resumed a parish tradition of welcome dinners to gather and greet those new to the parish.

Advent challenges us to go deeper: to allow Christ's welcome into my own heart; and to reflect on how well I extend his welcome to others. Do I make room for the "other" person who comes into "my" pew on Sunday and moves into "my" place? Have I asked the names of those sitting around me every week? When did I last make the effort to acknowledge someone sitting alone or apart? Do I offer others a face of welcome, maybe even a smile? Is "welcome" a ministry that we all share; or does it pertain only to "those people at the door"? When did I last invite family members, friends, or neighbors to join me for Mass or a parish event? Are we committed to preparing a way for the Lord on which we increasingly are

surrounded by those whom we have welcomed and encouraged, through word and example, to join us in giving thanks and praise for the presence of Christ in the world?

Who might *you* invite to join you, and us, for the celebration of Christmas and the Sundays before and after? To whom might Christ hope to speak through *your* voice? I encourage each of us to consider extending a word of welcome and encouragement to someone who is not yet regularly among us; or to reach out to someone among us who is not yet connected to the community.

This week we encounter an odd liturgical technicality. December 8<sup>th</sup> is traditionally the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary in the womb of her mother Ann. Under this title, Mary is Patroness of the United States. Since the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence over Mary's feast, it has been moved to Monday, December 9<sup>th</sup>. When a holy day of obligation is moved to another *date*, the obligation to attend Mass does not apply. So, all are *welcome* (but not required) to join us for the celebration of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception this Monday at 8:30 AM.

This Thursday, Mexican Catholics honor Nuestra Senora de Guadalupe, the title under which Mary has been declared Patroness of the Americas. A mosaic of the image that appeared on the tilma of Juan Diego is located on the base of the northwest column of the baldachin. Her message was a call for all people of the Americas to learn to live as one family. May we respond to that call.

The Advent season offers us an important opportunity to rethink our lives and prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus, our redeemer and teacher; God who is with us no matter what, through every challenge and circumstance we face. Do you recall the story of "The Christmas Carol," written by legendary author Charles Dickens? In this luminous tale of hope and redemption, even the likes of a stubborn, miserly Mr. Scrooge is transformed by the light and love that surrounds him. ### Reflection for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception

Mary was a risk-taker---a risk-taker who put all her faith in the God of her ancestors; the God she believed in.

Even though Mary was conceived without the mark of original sin (Immaculate Conception), she had free will to accept God's plan for her or to reject it. It took a great deal of courage to say "yes" to God and risk everything. How would she explain being pregnant to her betrothed, Joseph? What would she tell her parents? How would the rest of her Jewish community in Nazareth relate to her?

She did question the angel, "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" With assurance from the messenger that it was all part of God's plan and she would be mother to the Messiah, Mary relied on her faith and accepted God's proposal.

She cooperated and is a model of discipleship for us. We, too, are invited to cooperate with God, giving up our own personal wants and desires and joining in a new life in Christ.

The angel identified Mary as "full of grace." Even before Jesus was conceived within her womb, she was already filled with God's life. Just as God saw Mary as a reflection of himself, he looks at each one of us in love and wonder and sees the essence of our being, created in his own image, full of grace. Do we see ourselves through God's eyes?

#### The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Thursday 8:30 am-8:30 pm, Friday 8:30 am-4:30 pm; Saturday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am-1:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.



## Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: January 25; February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: February 1 & 8; April 18.

Children in Grades K-4 will be invited to join their Reflector in a prayer space away from the adults and to hear the Word of the Lord in words they can better understand on the following Saturdays (subject to change): December 14 & 21; January 11 & 18; February 15 & 22; March 7, 21 & 28; and April 28.


#### **Parish Counselor**
