

# **Pastor's Notes**

#### Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks. 1Thessalonians 5:16-18

There was a time when I was a stickler for holding back on anything "Christmas" until all four candles of the Advent wreath had been lit. Some of this is rooted in my Ukrainian Orthodox ancestors, for whom Christmas Day was the beginning of twelve days of visiting relatives and friends that culminated with a large celebration on January 7, when Christ was revealed to the magi and thus to all peoples and nations. I held back on Christmas decorations; I mailed Christmas cards on December 24; I neither gave nor opened presents before Christmas Day; and I minimized my exposure to Christmas celebrations.

Then one year, when my youngest brother reached a certain age, our mother introduced us to the tradition of the rose candle on the Advent wreath as the date on which Christmas decorations could appear and Christmas celebrations begin. Perhaps she was looking for a way to spread out and share the work of decorating, wrapping, and baking for Christmas. Yet she also proclaimed the "middle Advent" that often gets overlooked in our focus on Christmas Day. Christ was born an infant in the town of Bethlehem long ago, and Advent prepares us to celebrate his birth on December 25. Christ will come to us in glory at the end of the world as we know it, and Advent calls us to be awake and ready to greet him joyfully on that day. The middle Advent reminds us that Christ comes to us in the people and events of each day. We have reason for rejoicing in this *moment.* We pray to recognize Christ as he comes to us now. And we give thanks for the light that Christ brings into our present circumstances:

personal, communal, and global. The rose candle calls us to celebrate not only the coming of Christ in a distant past or an anticipated future, but also the coming of Christ *today*.

So, my Christmas tree is being decorated, presents are being wrapped, and cards are being sent. The coronavirus may keep me from the usual celebrations in the days before Christmas. But it will <u>not</u> keep me from *the joy that is God's presence in this moment*; a prayer that I recognize Christ in <u>each</u> *day*; and gratitude for Christ's invitation to walk with him and invite him to dwell in my heart and mind.

Where does joy reach out to you this Advent? What conversation does Christ desire to have with you if you but offer him some time in prayer? What are the blessings in your life that the darkness cannot hide and for which you are grateful? Joy is our greatest witness to the presence of Christ among us. Perhaps your witness at this moment in life is not the bright and shiny joys of loud shouts and broad gestures. The deepest joys reside in our heart and allow us to smile even in sadness, to find peace even amid worries, and to give comfort even when my own heart aches. Our joy, especially in this moment, will invite others to want to know the source of that joy, Jesus, our Light.

I wish you the joy that is the grace of God. I pray for you to know and experience the coming of Christ into your life *here and now*.


# **Parishioner Volunteers Needed**

### **Meditative Nativity Walk**



Grace Lutheran Church has set up a lighted labyrinth on their Catherine Avenue lawn (north of Ogden Avenue) adjacent to the church building. The labyrinth is lit at dusk and the lights remain on until about 10:00pm. The Grace Lutheran community is inviting all area faith communities to come by any evening during the Advent and Christmas seasons to walk this path of prayer. An amazing artist couple who are members at Grace Lutheran has made this come to life.

### SAFE AND SOBER HOLIDAYS

Did you know that 10-13% of all the people in any community live with the disease of alcoholism or other chemical dependence? This includes 10-13% of our parish community. Each person who lives with a chemically dependent person also has a disease that negatively affects the lives of at least four other persons. 40% of the members of any community, including ours, know someone, or are concerned about someone, or are angry at someone who lives with this progressive and potentially fatal disease. The past nine months of living within pandemic restrictions has intensified this situation in many households.

If you care about someone who has a drinking or other drug problem, I encourage you to get help <u>for yourself</u>. Go to ALANON if you are affected by someone's chemical dependency. Go to FAMILIES ANONYMOUS if you are the relative or friend of a young person with drug or behavioral problems. Go to ADULT CHILDREN OF ALCOHOLICS if you are the adult child of someone with an alcohol or other drug problem. Get help for yourself before you attempt to intervene in the life of someone who is addicted. This is the best gift you can give to someone who is dependent on alcohol or another drug.

Most Al-Anon meetings in the Chicago area continue to meet virtually on Zoom, including a Zoom newcomer's meeting every Wednesday at noon. Newcomers continue to join this meeting. 
