

Pastor's Notes

*“Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid.
Mary has conceived a son through the Holy Spirit,
and you are to name him Jesus.”*
Matthew 1:20,21

Joseph receives this message from an angel in the first of three dreams, each of which will disrupt his life, his family, and his livelihood. Matthew tells us that this is how the Christ Child enters our world. This Child disrupts our expectations of what is to be and how it is to be. His conception and birth ask us to do things of which society, and sometimes even religious authorities, will question. The Christ Child sends us to “distant places” or “foreign lands” that open us to new ways of experiencing the diversity of God’s family. And this Child promises to remain with us as we face dangers from without, start anew in unfamiliar surroundings, and worry over those whom we love and who need our care and protection.

St. Francis of Assisi gave us a peaceful, gentle manger scene that reveals the heart of what happened in the world on that first Christmas night. Local shepherds and distant magi come together to meet this Child. Animals lie in peace around the Child, who lies swaddled in their feeding trough and brings a warm glow to a humble stable. Mary and Joseph kneel at his side in prayerful awe and wonder. *All is calm and bright.*

The reality must have been very different. Mary and Joseph were homeless; they were living in a cave that

provided just enough shelter to keep them safe and warm. Mary had just gone through labor after the exertions of a long journey from her homeland; she surely was aided by midwives but was without the comfort of her mother or other female relatives. Days, months, or possibly years separate the arrival of the shepherds and the arrival of the magi. Nonetheless, we can imagine a warm glow from the Child and prayerful awe in Joseph and Mary, trusting that *Emmanuel, God with Us, was with them in that manger* and that God would provide all they would need.

Many hands and hearts are offering their time and talent to prepare for the parish Christmas celebrations this Tuesday and Wednesday. They are preparing the room and the sounds in which we will join shepherds and magi in greeting the Christ Child. This Child is eager to *welcome us as we are* into the warming presence of God with Us. This Child encourages us to *invite others to join us* as we approach his manger bed. This Child *will carry us through* every moment and experience of our lives if we but invite him to accompany us.

Come, let us adore him!

Reflection for the 4th Sunday of Advent

The angel of the Lord told Joseph, “Do not be afraid to take Mary into your home.” Joseph found out his would-be wife, Mary, was already pregnant and so he wished to divorce her quietly. The angel offered him reassurance that the baby was conceived through the Holy Spirit. Joseph obeyed the angel despite most likely experiencing backlash from his family and the community.

We all get afraid from time to time, from kids being afraid of the dark to adults afraid of what the future holds after a loss. No matter how hard we try, we will have to come face to face with fear at some point. Joseph did, and so did Mary. Mary was likely terrified after learning the news that she, a young girl herself, was going to immaculately conceive and raise the child who was to be the Savior of the world. The very thing that sometimes has potential to bring us the greatest joy, at the same time can cause our knees to buckle to the ground with fear.

How do we stare fear in the face and still have the courage to overcome? Is it our willpower, resilience, calm disposition, or our physical strength? All this will fail us at some point. We have been given the answer to fear in the form of a person: Emmanuel, which means “God is with us”. As we journey through Advent to prepare for Christmas, it is important to reflect and remind ourselves of this beautiful reality. In this chaotic world that sometimes seems so full of heartache and fear, God did not leave us on our own to battle it out, and find our way to Him. He came down to our level, through His Son, to walk this journey with us.

Walking with Christ doesn’t mean fear will be forever absent. Mary and Joseph likely had many more fearful moments of their lives with Jesus, after initially saying “yes” to the call of the angel. In the midst of our pain, what we often long for is not that the pain will disappear. We want to know that we are not alone. Jesus comes not to take away all our fears, but to walk with us and remind us that He is in control, no matter the situation or the outcome. God is here with us! Will we invite Him in?

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: January 25; February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: February 1 & 8; April 18.

Children in Grades K-4 will be invited to join their Reflector in a prayer space away from the adults and to hear the Word of the Lord in words they can better understand on the following Saturdays (subject to change): January 11 & 18; February 15 & 22; March 7, 21 & 28; and April 28.

SAFE AND SOBER HOLIDAYS

Did you know that 10-13% of all the people in any community live with the disease of alcoholism or other chemical dependence? This includes 10-13% of our parish community. Each person who lives with a chemically dependent person also has a disease that negatively affects the lives of at least four other persons. 40% of the members of any community, including ours, know someone, or are concerned about someone, or are angry at someone who lives with this progressive and potentially fatal disease.

If you care about someone who has a drinking or other drug problem, I encourage you to get help for yourself. Go to ALANON if you are affected by someone's chemical dependency. Go to FAMILIES ANONYMOUS if you are the relative or friend of a young person with drug or behavioral problems. Go to ADULT CHILDREN OF ALCOHOLICS if you are the adult son or daughter of someone with an alcohol or other drug problem. Get help for yourself before you attempt to intervene in the life of someone who is addicted. This is the best gift you can give to someone who is dependent on alcohol or another drug.

Here are some healthy guidelines for holiday drinking and entertaining.

HOLIDAY DRINKING GUIDELINES

1. Drink only if you can. If you have been told not to drink, or if you take medication that does not mix with alcohol, don't drink.

Just one drink can hurt you.

2. Don't drink more than one drink per hour. If you can drink more than this without feeling any effect, you have a symptom of the disease of alcoholism.

A high tolerance for alcohol is a sign of disease – not a good thing.

3. Don't drink if you "don't drink." Don't take a beverage to avoid hurting your host or hostess.

Not drinking is okay.

4. Alcohol mixes better with the gasoline in a car than with the driver. If you plan on having a "really good time," then plan on not driving.

Drunk drivers can kill people.

HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING GUIDELINES

1. Never tell a guest, "Aw, c'mon. One drink won't hurt you. It's Christmas!"

The calendar has no effect on the effects of alcohol.

2. Don't serve more than one drink per hour to any guest. Minimize the time before serving food.

Don't poison your guests.

3. Don't give a guest who "doesn't drink" a hard time. Don't argue when someone says, "No thanks."

Provide non-alcoholic refreshments and let your guests choose.

4. Hot coffee or cold towels only make a person more awake. If a guest is drunk, do not let them drive. Get them a ride or cab or let them sleep it off.

Drunk drivers can kill people.

Surviving the Holidays

Some family situations can make the holidays difficult: there's no money; the kids are at the other parent's house; a loved one has died this past year. These top ten tips for "Surviving the Holidays" can help you exchange the dread, anxiety, or loneliness for a time of inner peace and hope.

1. Have realistic expectations. This year WILL be different; don't try to make it the same as other years.

2. Know you can stay home this year. This year you may feel like staying at home, which is a normal part of grief and healing. But many people will insist—maybe even push—to get you out. Be honest with yourself. If you are overwhelmed and need the security of solace, give yourself permission to stay in. If you go to the party and are ambushed by extreme emotions, give yourself permission to thank the host and leave early.

3. Do something special for yourself. Plan a time close to Christmas day to go to a good movie, do a little window shopping, drop into church for a prayer, or enjoy a special treat. It doesn't have to be lavish. If you'd rather stay home, then rent a favorite movie, cook a favorite meal, and cozy up in a way that comforts you.

4. Do something for someone else. One of the best ways to come out of our misery is to help someone else. Volunteering brings many back to the reality that God is good and there are many things for which to be thankful. Others focus their attention on Christmas presents for the children.

5. Keep it simple. Having a Christmas tree may cheer up some; but for others it will be too depressing. Sending Christmas cards can be very therapeutic; but for some it is a time-consuming and unnecessary expense. Re-examine everything you used to do during the holidays; keep what works and get rid of the rest.

6. Keep in touch with the children. Children crave routine and rituals which give them a sense of security—especially holiday customs. Keep as many of the holiday routines that they best love. Ask what their favorites are and help them focus on the fun.

7. Don't celebrate with your ex. Not unless it's been years, the kids are older, and you really do get along fairly well. It sounds good that you should all be able to get along at the holidays—but it's most often a myth. In most cases it confuses everyone, especially the children.

8. Help the children buy a present for their other parent. Imagine how difficult it would be to get a present for mom or dad without any help. Some things should never change . . . like encouraging kids to love, honor, and respect both parents.

9. Draw close to God. This holiday is about the answer to every person's prayer: God come to us in the flesh. Let Mary's kind eyes fall upon you and Joseph's strong gaze give you hope.

10. Go to Christmas Mass and rejoice in your heart. On Christmas day your emotions may be extremely tender; the tears may flow and the cries of your heart may mix with the strains of "Silent Night." But come. Come as you are. Know that you are loved. Know that there is hope. Know that if you remain open to God through the crosses of life there *will* be resurrection and salvation. *This* is the hope we have in these holidays.

O come, let us adore our God made flesh in Jesus.






