Pastor's Notes

"Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God."

Roman 11:33

Peter declares that Jesus is the Christ without understanding what this means. How often does our wisdom run ahead of our understanding, causing us to realize only much later how wise we were about something we did not understand at the time. God begins with us *where we are*, ever calling us forward into deeper understanding and firmer commitment to our mission in Christ.

Wisdom and understanding are at the heart of a strategic planning process that we began for St. Francis Xavier Day School this summer. A group including teachers, day school parents, parish staff, and other parishioners began our work with Maria Ribera of Catholic School Management, a consulting firm that has guided many schools in the Archdiocese and throughout the country in the strategic planning process. Committee members have begun the process of data collection and developing preliminary assumptions that will be brought to surveys and focus groups in coming months; the final plan will be shaped by as many members of the parish and day school community as possible.

Our consultant defines strategic planning as "a roadmap for how a school will carry out its mission and reach its vision"; it is "creating the preferred future of the school and planning how to arrive at that future." Over the next six months, we will be seeking,

gathering, and listening for the wisdom among and around us; this will enable us to set a strong course for our day school. We plan so that we will continue to grow in providing an excellent Catholic education, grounded in our core values of prayer, learning, and service.

Our parish day school is a core element of our parish mission; it provides a quality option for families who seek to educate their children within a Catholic cultural context. In collaboration with our religious education and youth programs, St. Francis Xavier Day School supports our families in their vocation to create and nurture church in the home, which is the lifeblood of our faith community and the Church in the world. This investment of time and resources continues to help us live out our mission. Our strategic plan will focus our energies and resources on reaching the future we desire for our children whose families choose to enroll them in our day school.

I encourage you to follow and engage in this process. Pray that we will be open to the guidance of the Spirit of Wisdom. Help us set a strong course toward goals that will support and enhance the quality Catholic education that we offer our children.

Welcome back, St. Francis Xavier Falcons! It is a great blessing to hear your voices and see your smiling faces on campus once more.

God bless you for your generosity and God bless all families in the parish as we kick off a new school year!

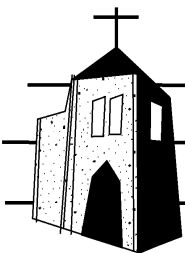

UNITY HALL AND FUNERAL VISITATIONS – PART TWO

These early months of experimenting with Unity Hall are a time of learning the creative possibilities and the limits of our new space. This summer, the parish staff discussed the challenges of making Unity Hall available for visitations on the day before the Funeral Mass (the traditional wake). As I announced in July, we have determined that we cannot accommodate an evening wake as a general rule; it too often would conflict with parish meetings, ministries, and activities, and requires accommodations for families and friends that a Funeral Home is better equipped to provide.

Our intention remains to offer visitations on the day of Funeral Mass in Unity Hall when the family prefers to begin at the church rather than at the Funeral Home. This can occur whenever the church is not in use for another service. To minimize facilities maintenance support, visitations in Unity Hall offer these accommodations:

Podium for a guest book and two easels for photo boards or other items
Kneeler (when a funeral director is available to move one from the church)
One floral arrangement (additional floral arrangements can be placed in the church)
Cups for water
The basic room setting of four round tables with chairs will remain in place, and no food or drinks other than water are allowed in Unity Hall.
When the parish can provide the required facilities support, three additional accommodations are available, for which a facilities fee will be asked.
Use of the projector and other audiovisual equipment in Unity Hall
Resetting the tables and chairs in the room (removing or adding)
Two additional easels

I ask your patience and understanding as we continue to consider how Unity Hall can best support our mission and ministries.

Your Invitation to Learn More about Catholicism

RCIA is a process of questioning and conversation for non-Catholics who wish to know more about the Church, and for Catholics who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.



New this year: St. Cletus, St. John of the Cross and St. Francis Xavier have combined efforts, to present the best of our three programs to participants. Leaders from all three churches will walk with you throughout the process. *If you have been thinking about becoming Catholic or completing your sacraments, please consider joining us.*

How it works: We will meet on Tuesday evenings, from 7-8:30 PM, and on some Sundays at various times from Sept. 19 – April 24. There are 4 stages in the Process:

1. **Inquiry** – a time to explore where God is calling you, ask questions, experience and learn about the faith, including: God, Jesus, the role of community, prayer, scripture, Mary, the saints; also, a tour of St. Francis Xavier Church. *Sept 19-Nov 5; meets primarily at St. Cletus*
2. **Catechumenate**– a time to dive deeper into key elements of Catholicism including: our approach to scripture, why we do what we do, signs & symbols, ritual, church history, what we believe, the 7 sacraments, and the mass. *Nov 7-Feb 13; meets primarily at St. Francis Xavier*
3. **Enlightenment**– a time of reflection and prayer before receiving the sacraments. *Feb 20-March 24 – meets primarily at St. John of the Cross; Sacraments will take place at the Easter Vigil, Sat. April 1, 8 pm at St. Francis Xavier.*
4. **Mystagogy**– a time to reflect on your experience, and what it means to live out your new life as part of the Body of Christ. *April 10 – 24 – meets primarily at St. Francis Xavier*
