

Pastor's Notes

"What profit would there be for you to gain the whole world and forfeit your life?" Matthew 16:26

"Father, what does Jesus have against being wealthy?" The question came from a man who was generous in his contributions of time, talent, and treasure. He was blessed with a comfortable income that allowed him both freedom and the ability to enjoy nice vacations with his family. Yet when he heard Jesus speaking of wealth, he felt that he was being judged. When Labor Day sermons emphasized Church teachings on the dignity of human labor and an obligation to support just wages and safe working conditions for all, these feelings intensified.

Jesus does not focus on the acquisition, possession, or lack of wealth; he does not advocate for a specific economic or political system. Rather, Jesus warns about the dangers of *preoccupation* with material wealth, whether by the one who possesses it or the one who seeks it. Jesus prioritizes the wealth of the Kingdom of God above all distractions — including the possession or pursuit of material wealth. It is not about what I have, but rather how I offer what I have been given to serve my vocation, my calling, within the Body of Christ, and to help others to do the same. Does my "wealth," in whatever form, lead me to enrich my family, my community, and the world community to reflect God's mercy in my relationships with others and the systems and structures that shape society.

Labor Day was established as a day to support and celebrate the rights of workers to organize for mutual

support, just wages, and safe working conditions. The Catholic Church was at the heart of this struggle in its early years. In our day, advocating for the dignity of human labor may involve complicated and conflicting political and social concerns. Nonetheless, the social teachings of the Church continue to challenge us to ensure that society respect the dignity of all human labor in its systems, structures, laws, and practices – to ensure that wealth is never acquired at the expense of others, and that wealth and its legitimate pursuit remain connected to the common good.

Perhaps Labor Day encourages us to make a personal connection with another's labor. We might seek to learn more about the labor that makes or repairs our cars, builds or remodels our homes, or expands and repairs our infrastructure. We might learn and use the name of the person who serves us at a restaurant, delivers our mail, or tallies our groceries. We might offer a greeting to those who collect our recyclables and trash, serve and protect our community, or teach our children and youth. We might look for some way to "share the wealth" that we bring to one another as we serve the common good through the work of our hands.

Let us offer our prayers and support to the people of Texas and Louisiana as they face the challenges of grieving what they have lost and rebuilding their lives and communities.

Scripture Reflection

This gospel begins with a clear statement of what we call the paschal mystery: Jesus will "suffer," "be killed," and "be raised." Peter recoils at this statement of Jesus' fate. So do we! Suffering and death is hardly an attraction that we would seek and make central in our daily lives. Yet it must be, for Jesus attests that the only way to have our life is to lose it. Why would we want to make losing our life—suffering and death—something central to our daily living? Like Peter, we tend to limit our vision by focusing only on the suffering and death, only on the bad news. The fullness of the paschal mystery always leads through suffering and death to new Life. And this is good news, indeed—the best of good news!

Authentic discipleship doesn't require us to seek suffering. Being faithful to Jesus will bring enough as it is. This is so because living and witnessing to Gospel values challenges so many values society touts are the ones that will bring us happiness. Ultimately, though, we find that only living Gospel values brings us lasting happiness, even though we must die to self in the process. All who wish to be faithful to Jesus' call to Gospel living must be prepared to suffer—and also be prepared to receive new life. The Life Jesus offers is worth any price!



UNITY HALL AND FUNERAL VISITATIONS – PART TWO

These early months of experimenting with Unity Hall are a time of learning the creative possibilities and the limits of our new space. This summer, the parish staff discussed the challenges of making Unity Hall available for visitations on the day before the Funeral Mass (the traditional wake). As I announced in July, we have determined that we cannot accommodate an evening wake as a general rule; it too often would conflict with parish meetings, ministries, and activities, and requires accommodations for families and friends that a Funeral Home is better equipped to provide.

Our intention remains to offer visitations on the day of Funeral Mass in Unity Hall when the family prefers to begin at the church rather than at the Funeral Home. This can occur whenever the church is not in use for another service. To minimize facilities maintenance support, visitations in Unity Hall offer these accommodations:

- Podium for a guest book and two easels for photo boards or other items
- Kneeler (when a funeral director is available to move one from the church)
- One floral arrangement (additional floral arrangements can be placed in the church)
- Cups for water
- The basic room setting of four round tables with chairs will remain in place, and no food or drinks other than water are allowed in Unity Hall.
- When the parish can provide the required facilities support, three additional accommodations are available, for which a facilities fee will be asked.
- Use of the projector and other audiovisual equipment in Unity Hall
- Resetting the tables and chairs in the room (removing or adding)
- Two additional easels

I ask your patience and understanding as we continue to consider how Unity Hall can best support our mission and ministries.

Lunch set-up and serving is from 10:45 am-1:00 pm. Lunch volunteers plate desserts, serve hot foods to guests in a buffet line, run the dishwasher, and wipe down tables and chairs following the meal. The minimum age is13 years old, accompanied by an adult, and there are 7 volunteer openings.

Your Invitation to Learn More about Catholicism

RCIA is a process of questioning and conversation for non-Catholics who wish to know more about the Church, and for Catholics who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.



New this year: St. Cletus, St. John of the Cross and St. Francis Xavier have combined efforts, to present the best of our three programs to participants. Leaders from all three churches will walk with you throughout the process. If you have been thinking about becoming Catholic or completing your sacraments, please consider joining us.

How it works: We will meet on Tuesday evenings, from 7:00-8:30 pm, and on some Sundays at various times from September 19-April 24. There are 4 stages in the Process:

- 1. Inquiry a time to explore where God is calling you, ask questions, experience and learn about the faith, including: God, Jesus, the role of community, prayer, scripture, Mary, the saints; also, a tour of St. Francis Xavier Church. September 19-November 5; meets primarily at St. Cletus.
- **2.** Catechumenate— a time to dive deeper into key elements of Catholicism including: our approach to scripture, why we do what we do, signs & symbols, ritual, church history, what we believe, the 7 sacraments, and the mass. November 7-February 13; meets primarily at St. Francis Xavier.
- **3. Enlightenment** a time of reflection and prayer before receiving the sacraments. February 20-March 24; meets primarily at St. John of the Cross; Sacraments will take place at the Easter Vigil, Saturday, April 1, 8:00 pm at St. Francis Xavier.
- **4. Mystagogy** a time to reflect on your experience, and what it means to live out your new life as part of the Body of Christ. April 10-24; meets primarily at St. Francis Xavier.

Habitat For Humanity

For more than 20 years, volunteers from St. Francis Xavier have made the trip to Clarksdale, Mississippi to work on new housing for deserving families. This summer three teams, comprised of approximately 50 volunteers, made the trip to Clarksdale. Our teams headed back to Clarksdale to finish Sherry Williams' new home which we started last summer and to begin construction on the next new home. Sherry was born in Clarksdale and is living in a family home that was passed

down to her. She currently lives with her daughter and granddaughter in their once proud family home that is quickly deteriorating and disintegrating due to its age, despite their best efforts to keep it up. Sherry's new house is very near completion after our teams worked on the interior, including: finishing and painting the walls, installing and painting the window trim, installing light fixtures, and laying floor tile.

Thanks to the generosity of the parish, St. Francis Xavier was able to double its contribution to Clarksdale Habitat for Humanity from \$11,000 to \$22,000! The increased contribution was necessary to begin construction of the next new home. Our teams prepared the site for the concrete slab, framed the house, built the trusses and installed the trusses.

All of this work could not have been accomplished without the generous support of our parish community and dedicated volunteers. Thank you! Your financial contributions, prayers, encouragement and sweat equity continue our mission to provide safe, affordable housing in Clarksdale, Mississippi.




